

FACILITY NEEDS ON CAMPUS

UTEP has a great need for new buildings on campus. The highest priorities for replacement are the Liberal Arts Building and the Academic Advising Building, which are 60 years old and 42 years old, respectively. During the 86th Legislative Session, legislation for Tuition Revenue Bonds (TRBs) failed at the last step. Although the COVID-19 pandemic has created a strain on the budget, now is an opportune time to utilize TRBs to address UTEP's facilities needs. Interest rates are currently low and investing in infrastructure will create jobs during the economic hardship created by the pandemic.

These TRBs would be used to create an Advanced Teaching and Learning Complex (ATLC - \$100M request) and a Student Success Building (\$50M request). The ATLC is designed to be a 21st-century collaborative learning environment to replace the oldest classroom building. The Student Success Building will serve as a unified center for students seeking services from UTEP's Academic Advising Center, University Career Center, and Counseling and Psychological Services.
