#### BIOGRAPHY

Joseph Malchus Ray was born October 14, 1907 to Joseph Edward and Vivia (Scott) Ray. Born in Bowling Green, Kentucky, little else is known of Ray's early years, until his college career. He attended the University of Texas from approximately 1929-1937. He obtained his bachelor of Arts, with honors, and both his Master's and Ph.D. studying Government, with a minor in History and Economics. Ray's Master's thesis was entitled **Law and Practice Governing the Diversion of Water from International Streams,** which he wrote in 1933. Also in 1933 he married his wife, Jettie Hollingsworth, of Hillsboro, Texas, on December twenty-sixth. They had three children, Scott Joseph, David Peter, and Sarah Jane. Dr. Ray was also an instructor of Government during his early years at the University of Texas, from 1934-1937.

When he graduated with his Ph.D., he obtained a job at North Texas State University, in Denton as an Associate Professor of Government. Even at this time he aspired to become a university president. In his memoirs he wrote "From the beginning of my academic experience, I began to fancy myself an administrator. In 1942, he moved to Alabama as Associate Professor of Political Science, and while there, was also Assistant Director of the Bureau of Public Administration. In 1946 he accepted a position as professor and Head of the Department of Government and Politics at the University of Maryland. During his stay in Maryland, he was also Director of the Bureau of Public Administration, 1947-1949, executive secretary of the Maryland Municipal League, 1948-1950, and Dean of the College of Special and Continuation Studies, 1950-1952. From Maryland, he went to a job as chief of the Air Forces' Education and Libraries Branch in Washington, D.C. He worked there from 1952-1957.

In 1957 Dr. Ray returned to Texas as president of Amarillo College, and in August, 1960, he became the sixth president of Texas Western College, which became the University of Texas at El Paso during his presidency. In 1968, Dr. Ray stepped down from the presidency, and joined the graduate faculty of the University of Texas at El Paso as H.Y. Benedict Professor of Political Science and President Emeritus. He subsequently wrote a memoir that discusses his reasons for retiring from the presidency, and the people involved in his decision. Dr. Ray also wrote and edited a large number of books and articles during his lifetime. A list of his publications has been included with the finding aid. He passed away on June 20, 1991 at the age of 83.

#### SERIES DESCRIPTION

Series I. Associations, 1966-1979. 12.5 linear inches (3 document boxes). Arranged alphabetically by the name of the association. This series consists of material collected from the associations J.M. Ray was involved with and/or interested in during his lifetime.

Series II. Notebooks, 1960-1977. 35 linear inches (7 document boxes). Arranged alphabetically into Daily Notes and Taft Seminar notes, then chronologically. This material consists of daily notes kept by J.M. Ray.

Series III. Scrapbooks, 1960-1979. 85 linear inches (17 document boxes). Arranged into two categories, chronological and alphabetical. This material consists of newspaper clippings pasted into scrapbooks.

Series IV. Speech Files, 1968-1972. 5 linear inches (11 document box). Arranged chronologically. This material consists of typescripts of speeches collected by J.M. Ray.

Series V. Subject Files, 1952-1976. 17.5 linear inches (4 document boxes). Arranged alphabetically by subject. This series consists of material collected by J.M. Ray, that pertains to variety of subjects, such as "Patty Hearst" or "Election 1972 Cartoons .

Series VI. Publications, 1929-1983. 49 linear inches (11 document boxes). Arranged into three categories: Collected by J.M. Ray; Edited by J.M. Ray; and Written by J.M. Ray. The material collected and edited by J.M. Ray is arranged alphabetically by title, and the material written by J.M. Ray is arranged chronologically.

Series VII. Photographs, n.d. 1 linear inch. Arranged by the original numbers on the back of the photographs. The photographs are of a group assembled at the Robert A. Taft Institute of Government.

Series VIII. Citations, Awards, and Realia (Oversized), 1952-1977. 2 linear inches (1 oversized flat document box). Location: Tier S, Shelf 6. Arranged by type of material, then chronologically. This series consists of items awarded to J.M. Ray over the course of his career, and an outdated type of recording tape.

### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Joseph M. Ray Papers consists of forty-four boxes and includes primarily daily notes, scrapbooks, and publications that he collected, produced, and edited. A large portion of the collection is from his years as President of the University of Texas at El Paso. It also includes a number of the notes and drafts for the books he edited after he stepped down and was given a graduate professorship.

The **Associations** series consists of correspondence, memos, bulletins, meeting minutes, and journals collected from associations J.M. Ray was involved with and/or interested in during his lifetime. They include the American Society for Public Administration, the El Paso Chamber of Commerce, the Federal Reserve Board and the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, Maryland Municipal League, where he was executive secretary from 1948-1950, and Phi Kappa Phi.

The **Notebooks** series consists of daily notes kept by J.M. Ray in a shorthand, which he reputedly learned for a secretarial job he worked at while in school. They have not been translated, nor is there a translation code.

The **Scrapbooks** consist of newspaper clippings that have been glued on to pages of such things as phone books, notebooks, and magazines. For example, J.M. Ray used a Newsweek magazine about Jimmy Carter's presidential campaign, and pasted dozens of other articles about Jimmy Carter, clipped from various newspapers, onto all the pages, leaving only the original magazine's article on that subject uncovered. Due to preservation considerations, the pages of clippings that were dated by J.M. Ray and were in notebooks, were removed from the original notebooks and placed in acid free folders. These have been labelled with the dates assigned to the original notebooks and arranged chronologically. The scrapbooks arranged alphabetically have been assigned subjects by the processor, as they were not labelled by J. M. Ray.

The **Speech Files** include speeches pertaining to the 1968 and 1972 presidential campaign and elections, and political figures. They are primarily collected from speeches given at the Fourth Symposium of Presidential Elections, some of which were used in a book Ray edited, The Coattailless Landslide, published in 1974.

The **Subject Files** were found mixed in amongst the other files, and labelled by the processor, as not everything was labelled by J.M. Ray. The subject files consist of articles, periodicals, annual reports, and other miscellaneous items collected by J.M. Ray.

The **Publications** have been separated into three categories. Items written by J.M. Ray have been arranged chronologically. Those collected and edited by him have been arranged alphabetically by title. The edited materials include drafts of the books, and notes used in the editing process.

The **Photographs** are of a group assembled in the Robert A. Taft Institute of Government. Joseph M. Ray is present. They have been arranged according to the numbers found on the back of the photographs, possibly written by Dr. Ray.

The **Citations, Awards, and Reallia** series consists of brass, stone, and paper awards given to J.M. Ray in the course of his career. The stone plaque, and the paper award were removed from the frames they came in, due to preservation considerations. The full wording of the awards has been included in the finding aid, to minimize handling of the originals. The realia is a set of Dictabelt audio recording tapes that were used to interview and record Robert Ewing Thomason.

The Joseph M. Ray Papers were donated to the University of Texas at El Paso Library C.L. Sonnichsen Special Collections Department by Joseph M. Ray. There were two donations in 1965 and 1983, but Dr. Ray may have brought in small amounts of material at other times.
