INSS Internship Application

Students interested in an internship opportunity must complete this application and return it to the Department of Criminal Justice. In order to be considered for an internship, the form must be received by May 30th for the fall semester and October 31st for the spring semester. Certain internships require extensive background investigations and applications may take longer to process.

Internship Application Process:

- 1. Students must be an INSS minor or must be in the INSS graduate program.
- INSS minors must have a GPA of 2.75 or higher and completed INSS 3302 with a "C" or better. INSS graduate students must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Students must have completed all required courses and completed at least two semesters at UTEP
- 4. This is a one semester internship program depending on agency eligibility (3 hours of credit) students must need upper INSS electives to be eligible.
- 5. Submit the Internship Packet which includes the application, an updated résumé, and the application essay.
- 6. Once this has been received, students will be invited for an interview with the Internship Coordinator. At this meeting, the student will be able to investigate the nature of the internship and ask questions relative to the work experience of the internship.
- 7. If the application is approved*, the student will receive agency contact information to begin their placement process or they will receive further instructions required by their chosen agency.
- 8. Placement of the intern is the responsibility of the intern. Spots at agencies are limited and are offered on a first come first serve basis within the needs of the agency.
- 9. Agencies will make the final determination in terms of the acceptance of the student for an internship.
- 10. Additional paperwork may be required by particular agencies. Please make sure that you have enough time to submit all paperwork to ensure that you register for the course on time and avoid late registration fees by the university.
