We have seen many exciting developments in the Public Administration program at UTEP this year. Dr. Hyunrang Han joined our faculty as Visiting Assistant Professor after completing her Ph.D. at Arizona State University. Along with contributing to a number of our core MPA courses, Dr. Han is also expanding MPA course offerings in nonprofit management, by developing new courses related to fundraising and resource development, and volunteer management.

We have seen great progress among our MPA student body in their studies, with 20 students graduating with their MPAs this year, as well as another 4 students completing their graduate certificates in Urban and Regional Planning. Our students continue to engage with public and nonprofit leaders through their coursework and through the Public Administration in Action series, led by Dr. Andonoska.

Our faculty were active in research on public and nonprofit organizations this year, with articles published in various academic journals, as well as presentations at national and internationally recognized conferences, including the annual conferences of the American Society of Public Administration (ASPA), and the Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action (ARNOVA), to name a few. Our team has also been developing a new fully online MPA, launching in Fall 2023.

#### Happy Retirement, Dr. Chilton!

Congratulations, Dr. Bradley Chilton on retiring from the public administration program at UTEP. Dr. Chilton was appointed as a tenured full professor in public administration at UTEP, and he served in that capacity for ten years. He served as the chair of the public administration program for six years, leading numerous initiatives to advance the study of public administration in this community, including the development of the program's current partnership with the Sergeants Major Academy at Fort Bliss.

Dr. Chilton holds a PhD from the University of Georgia, two master's degrees, and a JD from the University of Toledo. He has been a faculty member at six different universities before serving at UTEP, and his most recent book explores the public administration profession (with Drs. Stephen King, Viviane Foyou and Scott McDonald and published by Routledge). He has also published more than 40 articles and book chapters on topics in public administration and law, and he has taught thousands of aspiring professionals in public administration in his many faculty and leadership roles.



#### **Internship with El Paso County Community Services**

#### **Student-Alumni Mentoring Reflection**

In early Spring 2023, the MPA program met with alumni who expressed a desire to be more active within the program and provide support. One area that both alumni and current students expressed a desire to engage in was mentoring. Alumni volunteered their time and expertise and an email was distributed to students to participate. Jacqueline Cue jumped at this opportunity and was immediately put in contact with Cassandra Hernandez, MPA class of 2013 and El Paso City Council Representative for District 3.

"I wasn't sure I would receive a response right away for mentoring, but to my surprise Cassandra was very accommodating and although she had a busy schedule, she made herself available to me in a matter of days," Cue said. The two discussed similarities in their upbringing and their motivation for public service. Cassandra describes Jacqueline as "professional, and her questions were pointed and driven." She shared about her own academic journey, specifically what courses assisted her and which skills she wishes she spent more time developing. Spoiler alert: they are statistics and Excel.

One major thing that stood out to Jacqueline was Cassandra's attentiveness. "She is a great listener, which allowed me to open up about the challenges I face and even though she had just met me, I felt as if she understood exactly what I was going through." Cue shared that she was participating in job and internship fairs, which presented an opportunity for Cue to meet Representative Hernandez's staff. Jacqueline was offered a position in her office and started on May 8, 2023. Both Jacqueline and Cassandra encourage students and alumni to participate in the mentorship opportunity.

The culmination of the MPA curriculum is an intensive capstone project. PAD 5367: Comprehensive Integration of Public Administration allows students to select a research area, policy or program of their choice and utilize the skills of data collection/analysis, economic values, policy review, and other administrative skills to develop their own evaluations and findings. The course is rigorous, often including collaboration with organizations or government agencies; and allows students to fully integrate what they've learned in the classroom.

Students work diligently under the guidance of Dr. Andonoska or Dr McDonald as they formulate their research, evaluation instruments, and develop their own recommendations.

On April 27th, students in Dr. Ljubinka Andonoska's capstone course were able to share their research projects with MPA faculty, staff, fellow students, and their families. The Capstone Showcase brought their semester to a close and we are proud of the work that they have done and are confident in their ability to lead as public servants.

When asked about the progress she's seen in her students, Dr. Andonoska could not be more proud of their growth. "I am so inspired by each of them."
