LIFELONG **SUCCESS**

- · Complete MATH 1508 and other core courses recommended for your degree plan.
- Focus on English, Math, and Science courses
- Take at least 15 credit hours each semester, and 3 to 6 credit hours during the Summer term.
- · Participate in New Student Orientation.
- Meet with your Academic Advising Center Freshman Advisor before registration.
- Ask your Advisor about the COED recommended core courses for your degree plan.
- Join the Texas State Teachers Association.
- · Explore the American Federation of Teachers, the Bilingual Education Student Organization (BESO), Chi Sigma Iota, and Kappa Delta Pi International Honor Society in Education
- · Discover the world with a Study Abroad course.
- Strive for high grades. The Educator Preparation Program (EPP) requires a minimum GPA of 2.75 for admission.
- Take the THEA exam as early as possible if you did not pass all areas of the TSI. The EPP requires that you have passed either of these exams
- Discover tutoring resources.
- Visit the University Career Center and develop your CV and resume.

- · Take MATH 2303, PSCI 2303, remaining recommended core courses, and remaining 1000- and 2000level courses.
- Continue to focus on English, Math, and Science courses.
- Take at least 15 credit hours each semester, and 3 to 6 credit hours during the Summer term.
- · Look out for Educator Preparation Program (EPP) Workshop invitations in your UTEP email.
- Schedule an appointment with your CSS Advisor to submit your EPP application once you meet the EPP application requirements.
- Submit all Observation Forms to your CSS Advisor.
- · Engage in test preparation/professional development workshops. Check UTEP email and the CSS Events Calendar to learn about these opportunities.
- Ask Education faculty for guidance on finding a mentor in the teaching field.
- Explore community involvement opportunities in your field with the Center for Civic Engagement.
- · Prepare for interviews by recording special projects, campus involvement, field experiences, and lesson plans for your portfolio.
- Prepare for the content qualifying exam.

- · Complete prerequisite upper-division courses after admission into the Educator Preparation Program (EPP): MATH 3308 is a prerequisite for MATH 4302, and BED 4343 is a prerequisite for MSED 4310 and MSED 4310.
- · Meet with your CSS Advisor after admission into the Educator Preparation Program (EPP) to plan for state exams.
 - After admission, attend a Post-Admission Workshop to learn about EPP requirements, Student Teaching application requirements, and registration.
 - Maintain a clean record. Student Teaching requires a criminal background check.
 - $\stackrel{\cdot}{\text{Submit}}$ all Observation and Reflection Forms to the CSS.
- · Engage in a unique hands-on experience with methods COED courses taught at local K-12 schools. Check UTEP email to learn about these opportunities.
- · Expand your community engagement efforts with Project MOVE.
- Explore career opportunities with the DOD and Peace Corps.
- Participate in mock interviews and resume reviews.
- · Prepare for remaining qualifying exams.
- · Take state exams promptly after passing qualifying exams.
- Research post-graduate professional and educational opportunities.

- · Ensure that you qualify for Student Teaching (ST) by completing all degree plan courses and state exams. ST will be your only course during your final semester
- · Meet with your CSS Advisor at the beginning of the year to discuss Student Teaching (ST) application requirements and verify completion of all degree plan courses
- Apply for ST once you have passed your state exams and completed the semester prior to your graduation term.
- Apply to ST by May 31 to complete ST in the Fall
- Apply to ST by October 31 to complete ST in the Spring.
- · Attend the CSS and district Student Teaching Orientations once accepted into ST.
- Immerse yourself in Student Teaching, and stand out by volunteering for activities outside of the classroom.
- Engage with your field through diverse COFD seminars
- · Explore career opportunities at the Teacher Job Fair.
- Participate in a Graduation Workshop.

EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAM (EPP) REQUIREMENTS

Admission

- Submit Application Packet to CSS Advisor.
- Complete the Communication, Mathematics, and Component Area Option portions of the Core Curriculum with a grade of "C" or better.
- Complete at least 60 semester credit hours.
- Have a minimum cumulative UTEP GPA of 2.75.
- Pass the THEA or TSI.
- File a degree plan with a program advisor.
- Submit 3 Recommendation Rating Forms (RRF).
- Complete the EPP Application.

Testing

- Pass the Content and Pedagogy and Professional Responsibility (PPR) Qualifying Exam.
- Pass the Required Texas Examinations of Educator Standards (TExES). You have five attempts to pass each of the TExES.

Observation Hours

- Prior to Student Teaching, you must complete 30 hours of observation. Some of your courses will include this field experience component. For those courses:
 - Complete an Observation Form.
 - Submit the Observation Form to your CSS advisor upon completion of the course.

Student Teaching

- Complete all degree coursework and testing prior to applying to Student Teaching. Apply online during your second-to-last semester.
- Pass fingerprint/background check with a Social Security Number.
