YOUR CLASS SCHEDULE

- Focus on Math, English, and Science courses such as MATH 1320, RWS 1301, RWS 1302, and BIOL 1305/1107, BIOL 2311/211.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

- Meet with your advisor in the Academic Advising Center.
- Meet with your College of Education CSS Advisor to discuss EPP (Educator Preparation Program) admission requirements.
- Get off to a good start! You will need a 2.75 cumulative GPA to be eligible to apply to the EPP once you reach 60 credits. Reach out to your professors and utilize tutoring resources to help achieve a solid GPA.

- Explore other majors to determine if this major is a good match for your interests and abilities.
- Discover tutoring resources.

- Aim to complete Kinesiology program prerequisites.
- Continue working on University Core Requirements.
- Once you are in the final semester of program prerequisites, take KIN 3303 to learn about the major and start the KIN sequence.
- Apply to the KIN professional sequence while in KIN 3303.
- After acceptance into the KIN Professional sequence, move on to KIN 3332, which opens up the PETE concentration sequence.
- Make sure to maintain your 2.75 cumulative GPA required to be admitted into the EPP.
- Continue to meet with your AAC Advisor each semester until you reach 46 credits.
- Transition to the advisors in the College of Health Sciences after you have 46 credits.
- Meet with your CSS Advisor and review the EPP Application Documents.
- Attend a Group Registration Workshop to learn about EPP requirements, Student Teaching application, and registration.
- Apply for the EPP once you reach 60 credits and have met the other requirements.
- Explore community involvement opportunities in your field with the Center for Civic Engagement.
- · Join the Kinesiology Club.
- Adapt to a new culture with a student exchange program.
- Reflect on your developing educational and career goals.
- Engage in discussions about leadership and innovation at UTEP L.I.V.E.

- Work concurrently on the KIN Professional Core and the PETE Concentration Sequence.
- Make sure you have taken KIN 3315 to start the PETE sequence.
- Complete any remaining University Core requirements.
- Maintain communication with the College of Education to apply and be admitted into the EPP.
- Meet with your faculty advisor each semester in the Kinesiology Department.
- If you have not done so already, apply for the EPP once you reach 60 cumulative credits and have met the other admission requirements.
- Attend mandatory EPP Admission workshop after your application is approved.
- Meet with your CSS Advisor after admission into the EPP.
- Request a graduation audit through the CHS Student Support Center once you have reached 90 credits.
- Develop real-world job experience by completing an internship in the field.
- Continue engaging with your community with *Project MOVE*.
- Apply to the MHIRT program for a unique summer research experience in Ecuador, Costa Rica, or Panama.
- Seek out research opportunities by engaging with faculty.
- Join a study group.
- Join the Texas Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance for leadership opportunities and networking in the field.
- Research post-graduate professional and educational opportunities.
- Visit the University Career Center and develop your CV and resume.
- Prepare for the appropriate exams if applying to graduate school.

- Complete degree requirements, including the Kinesiology Core, PETE Sequence, and the All-Level Education minor requirements.
- Refer to your graduation audit to ensure you are aware of all remaining requirements for graduation.
- Remember you are expected to take Student Teaching TED4698 as the **only** class in your final semester (Fall or Spring). Make sure you have all other classes completed prior to Student Teaching.
- Any additional classes you wish to take with TED4698 must be approved in advance by the College of Education
- Ilf you have not done so already, request a graduation audit through the CHS Student
 Support Center once you have reached 90 credits.
- Continue to meet with your faculty advisor each semester in the Kinesiology Department.
- Meet with your CSS Advisor at the beginning of the year to discuss Student Teaching (ST) application requirements and verify completion of all degree plan courses.
- Apply for ST once you have passed your state exams.
 Apply to ST by March 31 to complete ST in the Fall.
- Apply to ST by Oct. 30 to complete ST in the Spring.
- Apply to graduate in the CHS Student Support Center. Applications are available starting Dec. 1 for May and Aug. graduation, and applications are available starting Aug. 1 for Dec. graduation.
- Research global perspectives and trends in kinesiology, and identify opportunities for short faculty-led study abroad trips.
- Seek research opportunities with CAPHSR.
- Expand your community engagement efforts.
- Visit the University Career Center and revise your CV and resume.
- Take the appropriate exams if preparing for graduate school.
- Explore career opportunities at the Teacher Job Fair.
- Increase your marketability with school districts by taking additional state

All required freshman level courses specific to your degree pla must be completed prior to earning 90 semester hours.

A minimum of 30 semester hours must be completed at UTEP. 12 of the last 30 semester hours must be completed at UTEP

12 hours of advanced courses must be completed within 3 years 6 graduation.

Minimum cumulative grade point average to earn KIN degree is 250. A maximum of 66 semester hours of credit from two-year instituitons is applicable toward a degree at UTEP.
