# **Welcome to UTEP College of Liberal Arts**

With nearly 7,000 students, the College of Liberal Arts is the largest college on the UTEP campus, with degree programs in the visual and performing arts, the humanities and the social sciences. The college also provides most of the UTEP core curriculum to students in all colleges. Excellence is found throughout the college's programs, from its online bilingual M.F.A. in Creative Writing - the first of its kind in the country to its doctoral degrees in Borderlands History, Rhetoric and Composition, and Psychology.
