- · Review core requirements.
- Take core courses, focusing on classes that will enhance your verbal and analytical skills, such as RWS 1301 and 1302.
- Examine the options for your core Math requirement, Take MATH 1319, 1320. 1409, or 1508 in order to unlock future courses.
- Take SOCI 1301 to determine if sociology is the right major for you.
- · Meet with your Academic Advising Center advisor before registration.
- Visit the Academic Advising Center for a language placement exam.
- · Ask your advisor about joining a learning community.
- · Explore student organizations such as The Sociology Club.
- · Engage with your field by attending lectures hosted by the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
- · Discover tutoring resources, such as the University Writing Center and the Math Resource Center for Students.
- · Cultivate healthy lifestyle habits by visiting the Student Recreation Center.
- Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- · Visit the University Career Center and begin developing your resume or CV.

- Take SOCI 2312 and SOCI 3000-4000
- Begin taking courses for your language requirement.
- Meet with your Academic Advising Center advisorbefore registration.
- Ask your advisor about the benefits of Study Abroad courses.
- Discuss minor options with your advisor.
- · Reach out to the LSPI if you are considering law school.
- Discover community engagement opportunities in your field through the Center for Civic Engagement.
- Continue to engage with The Sociology Club, and explore other student organizations.
- Explore the world with a Study Abroad course
- Engage with your field by attending lectures hosted by the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.

- · Select a minor or double major that complements your interests within sociology.
- · Schedule an appointment early to meet with your advisor in the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
- Ask your advisor about postsecondary opportunities, such as graduate school in sociology or other professional postsecondary options like law school.
- Reach out to the LSPI if you are considering law school.
- Visit the College of Liberal Arts Student Success Center once you reach 90 hours for a review of your degree plan.
- · Cultivate Leadership opportunities in The Sociology Club.
- · Consider submitting papers to student or professional conferences as advised by your faculty mentors.
- Build on your community-engagement efforts by participating in Project MOVE.
- · Identify a faculty mentor for guidance on research opportunities, postsecondary options, and in anticipation of securing a letter of recommendation for graduate and professional applications.
- Investigate opportunities for graduate or professional study.
- Research your direction in life, and determine whether you will pursue graduate work, private employment, or other postsecondary opportunities.
- Research relevant exams for graduate or professional study, such as the GRE, LSAT, GMAT, or MCAT.

- Take SOCI 4301 and SOCI 3000-4000 electives.
- · Complete minor or double major requirements.
- Schedule an appointment early to meet with your advisor in the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
- Review your graduation audit with the Graduation Director.
- Expand your leadership efforts with The Sociology Club.
- Consider submitting papers to student or professional conferences as advised by your . faculty mentors.
- Engage with your field by attending lectures hosted by the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
- Register early to take exams before or during the first semester of your Senior year. Provide yourself with time to retake exams if needed.
- Work closely with your faculty mentor to prepare applications at the beginning of your Senior year. Explore job fairs and pursue career opportunities.
