Grass	<i>Bouteloua gracilis</i> 'Blonde Ambition' PP22048	<a href="#">Blonde Ambition Blue Grama</a>	1 gal	This showy selection of blue grama grass has huge chartreuse flowers that dance above the foliage
Grass	<i>Muhlenbergia capillaris</i>	<a href="#">Regal Mist®</a>	5 gal	A frothy haze of deep pink flowers covers the plant in the fall.
Grass	<i>Nassella tenuissima</i>	<a href="#">Mexican Feather Grass</a>	1 gal	Light breezes turn this fine-textured and billowy grass into living sculpture. Mexican feather grass forms a clump of chartreuse thread-like leaves and stems which turns gold in the winter.
Grass	<i>Sporobolus airoides</i>	<a href="#">Alkali Sacaton</a>	1 gal	Happy in full sun or partial shade, this grass can adapt to just about any soil, and can even tolerate saline situations.
Groundcover	<i>Drosanthemum speciosum</i> 'Rosea'	<a href="#">Rose Iceplant</a>	1 gal	This groundcover forms a dense, flat mat of small, sparkly succulent green leaves. Shocking pink-purple blooms cover this plant from mid-spring to summer
Groundcover	<i>Gazania rigens</i> 'Sun Gold'	<a href="#">Gazania 'Sun Gold'</a>	1 gal	This trailing evergreen groundcover forms a dense mound of gray, fuzzy leaves, with bright yellow daisy-like flowers held above the foliage
Groundcover	<i>Glandularia pulchella</i>	<a href="#">Rock Verbena</a>	1 gal	Masses of purple flowers adorn this perennial groundcover from spring through fall.
Groundcover	<i>Lantana montevidensis</i>	<a href="#">Purple Trailing Lantana</a>	1 gal	This tough native of South America quickly forms a low mounding groundcover with dark green, aromatic, rough-textured foliage.
Groundcover	<i>Malephora lutea</i>	<a href="#">Rocky Point Iceplant</a>	1 gal	Collected from a yard in Rocky Point, Mexico, this groundcover has succulent, bright green leaves that provide a lush backdrop for yellow daisy-like flowers.
Groundcover	<i>Teucrium chamedrys</i> 'Prostratum'	<a href="#">Prostrate Germander</a>	1 gal	This prostrate, dense, mounding perennial is native to the Mediterranean. Small, leathery dark green leaves are accented in the spring and summer by short spikes of lavender flowers.
Vine	<i>Epixiphium wislizeni</i>	<a href="#">Balloon-sepal Snapdragon Vine</a>	3"	A small vine with arrowhead-shaped leaves and pale blue flowers. Grown from seed collected at the Chihuahuan Desert Gardens
Vine	<i>Lonicera X Americana</i> 'Pam's Pink'	<a href="#">Pam's Pink Honeysuckle</a>	5 gal	This evergreen, twining shrub has waxy blue-green foliage and lightly scented, cream and pink blossoms.
Vine	<i>Parthenocissus sp.</i> Hacienda Creeper™	<a href="#">Parthenocissus sp. Hacienda Creeper™</a>	5 gal	This self-attaching deciduous vine is a compact, slow-growing selection, with bright green palmate leaves.

Perennial	<i>Conoclinium (Eupatorium) dissectum</i> Boothill™	<a href="#">Gregg's mistflower</a>	1 gal	During the warm season this plant is covered with clusters of fuzzy lavender flowers that are magnets for butterflies.
Perennial	<i>Gaillardia X 'Arizona Sun'</i>	<a href="#">Arizona Sun Blanketflower</a>	1 gal	Arizona Sun is a variety selected for its profuse display of large, two-toned flowers that are produced throughout the warm season.
Perennial	<i>Gaura lindheimeri</i> 'Pink Cloud'	<a href="#">Pink Cloud Gaura</a>	1 gal	Leaves are narrow and dark green, often with a purple tinge. Sprays of pink flowers are produced spring through fall, but here in the low desert blooming slows down in the summer.
Perennial	<i>Lygodesmia texana</i>	<a href="#">Texas Skeleton Plant</a>	3"	Leafless branching stems are topped with lavender flowers throughout much of the summer. Grown from seed collected at the Chihuahuan Desert
Perennial	<i>Melempodium leucanthum</i>	<a href="#">Blackfoot Daisy</a>	1 gal	It has narrow grey-green leaves, brittle stems, and is covered with small white daisy flowers in the warm months
Perennial	<i>Oenothera caespitosa</i>	<a href="#">Tufted Evening Primrose</a>	1 gal	From spring through late summer it produces masses of huge white flowers that open in the late afternoon and fade to pink by morning.
Perennial	<i>Penstemon baccharifolius</i> Diablo™	<a href="#">Diablo™ Rock Penstemon</a>	1 gal	It blooms in the late spring and summer with short terminal spikes of rose-red flowers that attract hummingbirds.
Perennial	<i>Penstemon barbatus</i> 'Coral Baby'	<a href="#">Coral Baby Penstemon</a>	1 gal	This stunning hybrid <i>Penstemon barbatus</i> is a blooming machine.
Perennial	<i>Poliomintha maderensis</i> Lavender Spice™	<a href="#">Mexican Oregano</a>	1 gal	This mounding, brittle, woody perennial has small, bright green leaves with a delicious oregano fragrance.
Perennial	<i>Ruellia brittoniana</i> 'Rosa'	<a href="#">Dwarf Ruellia 'Rosa'</a>	1 gal	This compact herbaceous perennial has long, narrow, dark green leaves and blooms heavily during the warm months with showy tubular, petunia-like pink flowers.
Perennial	<i>Salvia farinacea</i>	<a href="#">Mealycup Sage</a>	3 gal	Mealycup sage provides an attractive mass of blue flowers in beds, borders and naturalized areas.
Perennial	<i>Salvia greggii</i>	<a href="#">Autumn Sage</a>	5 gal	Beautiful clusters of red flowers are produced at branch tips all through the warm season, but in the low desert flower production will drop off in the summer.
Perennial	<i>Salvia greggii</i> Sierra Linda™	<a href="#">Autumn Sage Sierra Linda™</a>	5 gal	This woody perennial is native to Texas and Mexico, and forms a rounded mound of glossy green leaves. In the spring and fall it blooms profusely with small hot pink flowers, attracting hummingbirds.

Perennial	<i>Salvia X 'Ultra Violet'</i>	<a href="#">Ultra Violet Sage</a>	5 gal	'Ultra Violet' is a cross between blue flowered <i>Salvia lycioides</i> and pink <i>Salvia greggii</i> . This stunning <i>Salvia</i> grows to 20" tall and 28" wide and will display a showy set of vibrant purple blooms from late spring through October.
Perennial	<i>Sphaeralcea ambigua</i> Louis Hamilton™	<a href="#">Louis Hamilton™ Globe Mallow</a>	1 gal & 5 gal	This cutting-grown selection of the species has bright red-orange blossoms.
Perennial	<i>Tetraneris acaulis</i>	<a href="#">Angelita Daisy</a>	1 gal	It forms a compact, dense mound of slender green grass-like leaves. Golden daisy-like blossoms perch above the foliage on tall, leafless stems during the warm months.
Perennial	<i>Wedelia texana</i> Devil's River™	<a href="#">Devil's River™</a>	1 gal	This Texas native provides a lot of summer color, blooming from spring through fall with orange-yellow daisy-like flowers.
Perennial	<i>Zinnia acerosa</i>	<a href="#">Desert Zinnia</a>	1 gal	Native from southern Arizona to west Texas, this semi-woody perennial has gray-green needlelike leaves. In the summer it is covered with many small, papery white flowers with yellow centers.
Bulb	<i>Zephyranthes candida</i>	<a href="#">White Rain Lily</a>	1 gal	Native to Central and South America, this little bulb forms a clump of narrow, glossy, dark green leaves. In the summer and early fall, it is covered with waxy white flowers.
Bulb	<i>Zephyranthes X 'Prairie Sunset'</i>	<a href="#">Coral Rain Lily</a>	1 gal	This hybrid between <i>Zephyranthes x 'Capricorn'</i> and <i>Zephyranthes candida</i> has a more evergreen quality during the hot summer months. The waxy crocus-like flowers are apricot colored.
Shrub	<i>Anisicanthus quadrifidus v. wrightii</i>	<a href="#">Mexican Fire™</a>	5 gal	Its narrow, rich green leaves provide an effective backdrop for terminal spikes of tubular red-orange flowers.
Shrub	<i>Artemesia filifolia</i>	<a href="#">Sand Sage</a>	1 gal	The fragrant, threadlike leaves and stems of this airy evergreen shrub are covered with white hairs, giving it a lovely silvery cast.
Shrub	<i>Artemesia frigida</i>	<a href="#">Fringed Sage</a>	1 gal	This petite sage is surprisingly delicate in appearance, forming a soft mat of fine textured, aromatic silvery foliage
Shrub	<i>Atriplex canescens</i>	<a href="#">Four Wing Saltbush</a>	1 gal	Female plants produce unique papery-thin, 4-winged fruit that are a favorite source of food for birds and small mammals.
Shrub	<i>Berberis trifoliolata</i>	<a href="#">Agarita, Agarito</a>	5 gal	A rounded shrub with beautiful gray-green, holly-like foliage and clusters of fragrant yellow flowers from February through April.

Shrub	<i>Caryopteris X clandonensis</i> 'Dark Knight'	<a href="#">Blue Mist</a>	5 gal	Long, narrow grey-green aromatic leaves serve as an effective backdrop for the blue flowers.
Shrub	<i>Chrysactinia mexicana</i>	<a href="#">Damianita</a>	5 gal	This small evergreen shrub has fragrant, bright green needlelike foliage. It blooms heavily in the fall and spring with golden daisy-like flowers.
Shrub	<i>Ericameria laricifolia</i> 'Desert Mountain'	<a href="#">Turpentine bush 'Desert Mountain'</a>	1 gal	The aromatic needlelike leaves are covered with a sticky resin that smells like turpentine. Masses of showy yellow daisy-like flowers are produced at the branch tips in the fall.
Shrub	<i>Ericameria nauseosa v. speciosa</i>	<a href="#">Rabbitbrush</a>	1 gal	This semi-evergreen shrub has aromatic narrow, grey-green leaves and the stems are covered in white wooly hairs
Shrub	<i>Fallugia paradoxa</i>	<a href="#">Apache Plume</a>	1 gal & 5 gal	It blooms in the spring with small white flowers, followed by white to pink feathery fruit clusters
Shrub	<i>Plumbago scandens</i> 'Summer Snow'	<a href="#">White Plumbago</a>	1 gal	Dark, glossy green narrow leaves provide a lush backdrop for masses of white flowers that appear all summer.
Shrub	<i>Rhus virens v. virens</i>	<a href="#">Evergreen Sumac</a>	5 gal	The dark green, rounded compound leaves have thick waxy leaflets. Clusters of white flowers in the spring are followed by showy red berries.
Shrub	<i>Salvia chamaedryoides</i>	<a href="#">Mexican Blue Sage</a>	1 gal	This low mounding perennial has small, fragrant, silvery leaves that make an effective backdrop for the short spikes of bright blue flowers.
Shrub	<i>Salvia clevelandii</i>	<a href="#">Chaparral Sage</a>	1 gal	This evergreen shrub has highly aromatic gray-green foliage. The unusual flower spikes consist of clusters of blue-violet flowers stacked like shish-kebobs along the spike.
Shrub	<i>Tecoma stans v. stans</i> 'Gold Star'	<a href="#">Yellow Bells 'Gold Star'</a>	5 gal	This selection of the species blooms profusely with large clusters of bright yellow flowers.
Shrub	<i>Tecoma X</i> 'Crimson Flare'	<a href="#">Crimson Flare Esperanza</a>	5 gal	This clone has outstanding deep green foliage, providing a showy backdrop for the red blossoms.
Shrub	<i>Tecoma X</i> 'Orange Jubilee'	<a href="#">Orange Jubilee</a>	5 gal	This semi-deciduous, upright woody shrub has lush green compound leaves and produces masses of orange trumpet-shaped flowers during the warm months.
Shrub	<i>Tecoma X</i> Sierra Apricot®	<a href="#">Sierra Apricot® Esperanza</a>	5 gal	This petite Esperanza delivers a powerful punch of apricot color in the summer months. This garden gem is smaller than previous selections, with a compact and dense form.

Shrub	<i>Vauquelinia californica</i>	<a href="#">Arizona Rosewood</a>	5 gal	The dark green, leathery, lance-shaped leaves resemble those of oleander, except the margins are serrated. Flattened clusters of tiny white flowers appear in late spring, eventually developing into persistent tan fruit.
Shrub	<i>Viguiera stenoloba</i>	<a href="#">Skeleton-leaf Goldeneye</a>	1 gal & 5 gal	Bright green thread-like foliage provides a great backdrop for the yellow daisy-like flowers generated during the summer months
Tree	<i>Chilopsis linearis</i> 'Bubba'	<a href="#">Bubba Desert Willow</a>	15 gal	In late spring and summer 'Bubba' produces masses of large, dark burgundy, fragrant flowers.
Tree	<i>Forestiera neomexicana</i>	<a href="#">New Mexico Olive</a>	5 gal	New Mexico Olive is a small vase-shaped, deciduous tree. It blooms in the early spring with small yellow flowers that provide rich nectar for honeybees.
Tree	<i>Prunus mexicana</i>	<a href="#">Mexican Plum</a>	15 gal	Mexican Plum is a small-scale, single-trunked tree which produces masses of fragrant white flowers in the springtime.
Tree	<i>Quercus muhlenbergii</i>	<a href="#">Chinquapin Oak</a>	15 gal	Native to west Texas, this deciduous tree has large oval green leaves with wavy margins. In the fall, the leaves turn orange and bronze.
Tree	<i>Sophora secundiflora</i>	<a href="#">Texas Mountain Laurel</a>	5 gal	Glossy dark green compound leaves provide a lush look for desert gardens. Showy clusters of purple wisteria-like flowers perfume the air in the spring, and smell like grape soda.
Succulent	<i>Agave ovatifolia</i> 'Frosty Blue'	<a href="#">Whale's Tongue Agave</a>	5 gal	This stunning agave has a bold silhouette and short, wide powder-blue leaves.
Succulent	<i>Bulbine frutescens</i> 'Tiny Tangerine'	<a href="#">Tiny Tangerine Bulbine</a>	1 gal	From fall through spring the plants are topped by 12-inch-long spikes of orange flowers
Succulent	<i>Dasyilirion texanum</i>	<a href="#">Green Desert Spoon, Sotol</a>	1 gal	The rosette of long, narrow, leathery green leaves blooms with an 8-foot-tall spike of creamy white flowers.
Succulent	<i>Euphorbia rigida</i>	<a href="#">Gopher Plant</a>	1 gal	Its long, arching stems are lined with fleshy, grey-green leaves. Broad clusters of chartreuse flowers occur at the branch tips in the winter and early spring.
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe funifera</i> ssp. <i>chiangii</i>	<a href="#">Wide-leaf Hesperaloe</a>	5 gal	This unarmed plant is characterized by wide, deep green leaves that are edged with coarse white filaments. It sends up an eight to twelve foot high flower stalk in late spring or early summer.
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe nocturna</i>	<a href="#">Night-blooming Hesperaloe</a>	5 gal	This evergreen accent plant forms a dense rosette of narrow, light green leaves up to 4 feet long.

Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> 'MSWNERED' Sandia Glow®	<a href="#">Sandia Glow® Red Yucca</a>	2 gal	This selection will stay a little smaller than the species, growing to a mature size of under 3 feet tall and wide. This selection has large bloom stalks with watermelon red flowers
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> 'MSWNERMA' Desert Dusk®	<a href="#">Desert Dusk® Red Yucca</a>	2 gal	This selection has unique maroon flowers on an upright and compact flower spike
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> 'PERPA' Brakelights®	<a href="#">Brakelights® Red Yucca</a>	1 gal & 3 gal	This selection of <i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> has traffic-stopping, vivid red flowers and a compact growth habit.
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe X 'PERFU'</i> 'Pink Parade'	<a href="#">Pink Parade Hesperaloe</a>	5 gal	The leaves are bright green, about an inch wide, and form an upright clump to 3-4 feet tall and wide. The 8-foot-tall flower spikes remain very straight, forming a linear pink line when planted in rows.
Succulent	<i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> Desert Flamenco®	<a href="#">Desert Flamenco® Red Yucca</a>	5 gal	Compared to regular Red Yucca, this plant displays loads of side branching on the flower spikes creating waterfalls of showy, tubular, pinkish-orange flowers.
Succulent	<i>Manfreda maculosa</i>	<a href="#">Texas Tuberosa</a>	3 gal	This unusual succulent from Texas forms a clump of leaves similar to an Agave, but softer and without spines. The leaves are gray-green, covered with purple spots.
Succulent	<i>Nolina microcarpa</i>	<a href="#">Bear Grass</a>	1 gal	This grass-like plant forms a clump of slender leathery green leaves with finely toothed margins.
Succulent	<i>Nolina texana</i>	<a href="#">Bear Grass</a>	1 gal & 5 gal	The slender leaves have smooth margins and soft tips. In late spring a 2-foot-tall spike of flowers is produced down inside the rosette of foliage.
Succulent	<i>Opuntia cacanapa</i> 'Ellisiana'	<a href="#">Perennial Spineless Prickly Pear</a>	5 gal	When someone asks for a cold-hardy spineless prickly pear, this is the one to use!
Succulent	<i>Opuntia santa rita</i> Tubac™	<a href="#">Tubac™ Purple Prickly Pear</a>	5 gal	Rounded pads are a soft blue-grey color in the warm months, deepening to a rich purple in the winter.
Succulent	<i>Opuntia X 'Kelly's Choice'</i>	<a href="#">Opuntia X 'Kelly's Choice'</a>	5 gal	The compact growth form coupled with the intense pink flowers in the spring are a great combination.
Succulent	<i>Yucca elata</i>	<a href="#">Soaptree Yucca</a>	5 gal	This treelike yucca grows in southeastern Arizona, New Mexico, west Texas and Mexico. A spherical head of narrow, flexible leaves crowns each branch.
Veggie	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	<a href="#">Sweet Pepper Orange Sun</a>	3"	Yields many, sweet 4 to 5" fruits that ripen to a vibrant orange. Ideal for grilling, sautéing and stuffing.

Veggie	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	<a href="#">Cal Wonder Red Bell Pepper</a>	3"	This heirloom variety yields sweet, juicy, classic 3–4 inch bell peppers that ripen from dark green to red on vigorous, upright plants. Excellent fresh, roasted, sautéed or stuffed.
Veggie	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	<a href="#">Pico de Pajaro Chile</a>	3"	"Bird's beak." From Yecora, Sonora. The knobby fruit are often curved. Mild heat.
Veggie	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	<a href="#">Chimayo Chile</a>	3"	An heirloom chile grown for generations in the Chimayo Valley of northern New Mexico. This native strain has fantastic red chile flavor. At first it tastes sweet and then medium hot.
Veggie	<i>Capsicum annuum</i>	<a href="#">Isleta Chile</a>	3"	An exceptionally tasty native New Mexico chile traditionally strung into ristras, then ground. It has broader shoulders and is less fleshy than Isleta
Veggie	<i>Cucumis melo</i>	Melon Mexicano	3"	A small, very sweet cantaloupe-type melon originally collected in Redford, Texas.
Veggie	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	<a href="#">Dark Star Zucchini</a>	3"	A SEEDS OF CHANGE™ original, this exciting new zucchini requires less water than other varieties. Open plants with smooth, spineless stalks yield classy dark green fruits all summer.
Veggie	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	<a href="#">Yellow Crookneck Squash</a>	3"	This easy-to-grow, heirloom, yellow summer squash produces abundant fruits with graceful necks that are famous for flavor.
Veggie	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	<a href="#">Flamenco Tomato</a>	3"	Flamenco is a cross between Silvery Fir Tree for earliness and feathery foliage and Floridade for heat and disease resistance. The result is a semi-determinate 4' bush loaded with highly flavored 2", red round fruits.

Great paste tomato. Performed impressively in our 2012 trials in Tucson, producing throughout the summer despite full exposure and harsh conditions.
Veggie	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i>	Texas Wild Cherry Tomato	3"	Collected from a patch of apparently "wild" tomatoes in southern Texas. Sprawling plants produce tons of small, tasty, cherry-type tomatoes.
Veggie	<i>Solanum melongena</i>	<a href="#">Black Beauty Eggplant</a>	3"	This popular heirloom variety yields plump, 4–5 inch diameter, shiny purple fruits with rich flavor great for eggplant parmesan.
