# **RIO BOSQUE REPEAT PHOTOGRAPHY RETURNS**

After a 4-year absence, the <u>repeat-photography</u> <u>archive</u> for Rio Bosque Wetlands Park is back on the park's web pages.

In 1999, UTEP established 28 permanent photographic stations at the park to help document changes over time. Every few years, we take 3 to 5 photos at each station, using the same bearings each time. In all, there are 103 distinct views captured in these photos. We took the most recent photos this year.

Currently, the online archive only displays the original photos (most, but not all, from 1999) paired with this year's photos. The images above provide an

### THEY'RE BACK

After nesting successfully at Rio Bosque in 4 different years between 2009 and 2017, **White-tailed Kites** continued to be seen at the park until late March 2021. Then came an absence of over 2.5 years. On Oct 27, one finally appeared again. The first sign of a return to the park, or just a transient visitor?

The absence of the park's **beaver** was much shorter. After over 4 years in residence, our beaver left last spring during a prolonged period with no water in most of the re-built former bend of the Rio Grande within the park. In mid-October, we started seeing signs that one was back. It is renovating the dams built last year and clearly plans to stick around. **X**
