SCHOLARLY AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES:

Organized a comprehensive concussion baseline clinic for young athletes in low-income school districts within El Paso County. Athletes in the Tornillo Independent School District participated in testing with the following stations: 1) demographic information, 2) cervical active range of motion and manual muscle testing, 3) balance testing, 4) vestibular testing, 5) neuro cognitive exam and 6) education for students and parents. The data was presented at the Texas Physical Therapy Association Annual Conference in 2016 as part of the Tom Waugh Leadership Program.

The Sun City Parkinson's Foundation is a non-profit organization created in 2016 to help serve the needs of people with Parkinson's in the El Paso and Las Cruces region. As a founding member of the organization, I have been involved in developing both educational and support-related activities for those fighting Parkinson's disease as well as their family members or interested members of the community.
