

BS in Rehabilitation Sciences Advising Information – Summer/Fall 2022

BS-RHSC students are responsible for:

1. Knowing your degree plan, including but not limited to:
 - *Pre-requisites and co-requisites*
 - *Course sequences*
 - *Where you have options and what those options are*
 - *GPA and grade requirements*
 - *Graduation requirements*
2. Preparing for **Graduate School** self-sufficiently, early, and using your resources:
 - Research which graduate programs you plan to apply to
 - Check the course pre-requisites, other application requirements, and deadlines of those schools (all available on each school's website)
 - When can I start applying? When is the application deadline?
 - When do I need my pre-reqs done?
 - Incorporating your grad program pre-reqs into your degree at an **appropriate time** (PT and OT should aim to get pre-reqs done **before** senior year)
 - Join the appropriate **Registered Student Organization** early, which will help you prepare to apply and provide mentoring for the process (PPTA, AOTSA, NSSLHA).
3. Registering **ON TIME** to have best access to courses (taking care of holds ahead of time)
4. Advocating for yourself and being **proactive**
5. Asking questions if any part of your degree plan is unclear – ask your advisor!
 All RHSC students with 0-45 credits are advised by the Academic Advising Center.
 Once you reach 46 credits, your advisor is in the CHS Student Support Center:

- Students are responsible for checking and making sure they have met pre-requisites for BS-RHSC Electives (pre-reqs are listed in the course descriptions here: <http://catalog.utep.edu/undergrad/course-descriptions/>)
- **PT Concentration** Students – remember you can only count 3 cr. of lower-division courses (1000 or 2000 level) toward your 15 cr. of BS-RHSC electives!
- For those of you on older versions of the degree plans, courses below include **additional options** for the concentrations listed. If a course below is not listed on the degree plan you received, you must request the substitution by emailing the course you wish to take to your advisor (see page 1). **If this is not submitted, the course will not count.**
- If you wish to take a class **not** listed on your degree plan or on the list below for a BS-RHSC elective, you must submit the request via email to your advisor with a **rationale** as to how that course fits into your professional plans.

**You must email your advisor if you want permission to take any KIN classes – departmental permission required and pre-requisites must be met

Additional Important Notes for all RHSC students:

- **RHSC GPA: 3.0 cumulative GPA is required to stay in good standing in the BS-RHSC major**
 - To be competitive for graduate school, you should work to get your GPA *significantly* higher than a 3.0!
 - Graduate programs look at your overall GPA but also specifically at the **pre-requisite GPA**, so keep that in mind.
- If you fall below a 3.0 GPA, you will get an **Academic Warning**. You have the next 12 credit hours to bring your cumulative GPA up to the 3.0.
 - If you **do not** reach the 3.0 GPA at the end of the academic warning period, you will be required to change your major. You will be **dropped** from any DRSC or SPLP courses that are on your future schedule if you are dismissed from the RHSC major.
- **DRSC Course Grades:** Students who receive a 'D', 'F', or more than two 'C' grades in their DRSC courses will be required to change majors.
- If you have issues registering for DRSC courses or SPLP courses, email your advisor **after** checking that you have met the pre-requisites and that the courses are listed on your degree plan.
 - For all other courses, you should contact the department offering the course if you have difficulties registering for the class – **after** you have checked that you have met the pre-requisites for the course

Additional Information for Speech Students

- All SPLP courses require departmental permission.
 - Permissions will be given to courses that are **on your sequence** (SEE SEQUENCE BELOW)
- Speech Concentration Students who started Fall 2020 or later must also maintain a **3.0 SPLP GPA**. Check your degree plan for the rules regarding this requirement.

- You cannot start the SPLP sequence in spring semesters – it only starts in fall semesters.
- If you have not yet started the sequence and you are above 46 credits – you will be placed on the 2-year sequence starting in Fall 2022. This will allow your earliest graduation date to be August 2024.
 - If you wish to pursue the 3-year sequence instead (earliest graduation date August 2025), please contact your advisor (See page 1) **before Fall 2022** registering.
- It is strongly suggested that you take BIOL2311/2111 before starting the SPLP sequence.
- If you have started the sequence – keep going!
- Remember you must earn Cs in each SPLP class to progress on to the next semester of the SPLP sequence.
