The second portion of the symposium will be presented by Dr. David A. Shirk where he will examine the trends in violence and organized crime in Mexico through 2016. Dr. Shirk is an author of the March 2017 Justice in Mexico report titled, "Drug Violence in Mexico-Data and Analysis through 2016".
