Grants

- ➢ Dr. Penelope Espinoza, in collaboration with Dr. Karina Canaba of COURI, secured an NSF grant for Using Iterative Design to Develop a Visual Tool to Promote Inclusivity in STEM Environments. The project aims to support Hispanic and Black scientists and engineers by addressing racial microaggressions in STEM.
- The National Center for Education Research made nine new awards under the FY2024 Research Training Programs in Education Sciences grant program. The Early Career Mentoring Program for Faculty at Minority-Serving Institutions grant was awarded to **Dr. Cynthia A. Wiltshire.**
- A research grant from UT Regents' Excellence Initiative was awarded to **Dr. Maartje Van Den Bogaard** for a project investigating the effects of working while pursuing studies in STEM. The research, a collaboration between the College of Education, the College of Engineering, and the Career Center, will fund the hiring of an assistant research professor and two postdoctoral researchers.

- Dr. Pei-Ling Hsu co-authored an article with a TLC PhD student, Dina Thomason, which was published in a top-ranked journal: Thomason, D. & Hsu, P.-L. (2024). The effect of a STEM integrated curriculum on design thinking dispositions in middle school students. International Journal of Technology and Design Education.
- Dr. Jesus Cisneros, in collaboration with Dr. Lucia Dura, Dr. Christina Convertino and PhD student Isaac Frausto Hernandez, co-authored an article published in the Journal of Hispanic Higher Education. The article is based on a mixed methods study exploring perspectives and experiences of servingness among UTEP faculty and students. The study was conducted by the Hispanic-Serving Research Council, with Dr. Christina Convertino as Chair and all authors as members.
