Why a Master of Music Degree?

More and more music professionals are earning their master's degree as a way to advance in their careers and enhance their music knowledge. Music teachers in public schools go through intensive training as undergraduates, but there is a limit to how much can be covered at that level. These teachers frequently lead ensembles as part of their work but need additional education and training to further develop these skills and to focus more intensely on specialized topics. UTEP's Master of Music degree in Conducting provides this in-depth training, and because it has a curricular component that can be completed online during the academic year when public schools are in session, this degree is convenient for working professionals.

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Admissions Requirements

To qualify for admission into the Master of Music with Concentration in Conducting program, you must:

- Submit a completed graduate admissions application and application fee
- Submit official transcripts in accordance with the requirements of the Graduate School
- Have earned a bachelor's degree in music or its equivalent
- Provide the following: a Statement of Purpose, two letters of recommendation, and a link to a 10-minute performance video

International students whose first language is not English must also submit:

- Official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of at least 79 on the online version, or 550 on the paper-based version

Admissions factors will be reviewed holistically to assess the potential of the applicant.

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Curriculum

The Master of Music with a Concentration in Conducting requires 30 credit hours, which consist of 15 hours of core coursework and 15 hours of additional music courses. The additional courses to be taken will depend on whether the focus is on orchestral conducting or choral conducting. All students are required to complete the following required courses with a C average or better.
