Proposal Title: Change to Psychology BA Degree Plan

The Bachelor of Arts Degree for Psychology has two types of elective course options. The PSYC Electives ("Select one of the following courses") and the Major Electives ("Select eighteen hours of the following with at least twelve upper division"). PSYC Electives require General Experimental Psychology as a pre-requisite. PSYC 4316 (which is a block elective) was properly removed from that option last year. However PSYC 4316 was also (incorrectly) removed from the Major Electives list of courses last year during this change. This list of courses includes every Psychology undergraduate course and should include PSYC 4316. Our request is that PSYC 4316 be placed back into the Major Elective option of courses in the Psychology BA Degree Plan.
