Proposal Title:	Revision to Secondary Education Minor/Concentration

The UTEP College of Education proposes to add one existing course, BED 4317: Teaching and Empowering English-Language Learners (ELL) in Secondary Schools, to the secondary education minor/concentration (all disciplines) in place of SCED 3317: Multicultural Education.

This proposed change is necessitated by state-level policy changes to teacher certification. In July 2018, the Texas Education Agency amended their requirements for teachers who have ELLs in their classrooms; these teachers now need to have ESL Supplemental certification (TExES #154 exam), in addition to their content certification. The three largest school districts in El Paso are now requiring that prospective secondary teachers (starting with English teachers) obtain ESL Supplemental Certification prior to employment. BED 4317, which is an existing course, addresses the competencies required for the ESL Supplemental and prepares secondary teacher candidates for this certification. Currently, these needs are being met through a course substitution process. Here is the list of secondary and all-level programs that will be modified:
