Proposal Title: Economics BBA Degree Plan

In the interest of streamlining degree plans and facilitate scheduling of courses with current faculty resources, the recommended degree plan is presented below for students pursuing a BBA in Economics beginning Fall 2022 . Specifically, the changes include the requirement of ECON 3320 (Money and Banking) instead of ECON 3310 (Managerial Economics) as part of the core and requiring BBA majors in economics to take ECON 3325 (Public Choice) or ECON 4330 (Public Sector Economics), International Economics (ECON 4325), Mathematical Economics (ECON 3372) or Introduction to Econometrics (ECON 3373), and History of Economic Thought (ECON 3380). The department will honor all coursework consistent with the current degree plan for students that declare prior to Fall 2022.
