Poetics of the sotto voce

Class meets in 907 Edu Building on Tuesdays from 6-9. Office hours in 904 / Rosa Alacalá's office on Tuesdays from 3-5:30.

Poetry of the *Sotto Voce*: When we hear whispers, what kind of attention does it command from us, what exchange takes place between the murmur and the leaning in to listen? In this course, we will step into the poetics of the *sotto voce*, and in it explore notions of secrecy, ghostliness, what is ephemeral though intimate, and what is inaudible though leaves traces. Together we will read work by Aracelis Girmay, Emily Dickinson, Inger Christensen, and the performances Cecilia Vicuña, among other poets, as well as consider the films and photography of Ken Gonzales-Day, Ana Mendieta, Chris Marker, Víctor Erice, and Abbas Kiarostami. Our meeting times will be divided into discussion of the texts, in-class writing and sharing, and presentations. You will produce a short chapbook, performance, or video, along with a 5-8 page introduction, for a final project bearing a relationship to the forms of the whispering voice.
