Proposal Title: Changes to the Master of Science in INSS Course Catalog

We are requesting to make a number of changes to the Master of Science in Intelligence and National Security Studies Course Catalog.

- 1. Two courses need to be removed from the MS INSS degree plan and INSS 5302 needs to be deactivated:
- 1a. PAD 5301 (Qualitative Research Methods for Public Administration) has been a required course for the degree. It is being removed because it is redundant with another required course, INSS 5300. PAD 5301 is a qualitative research methods course. Qualitative research methods are covered in INSS 5300 (Research Methods in Intelligence).
- 1b. PAD 5341 (Legal Issues in Homeland Security) has been a free elective for the degree. It is being removed because it is no longer part of the Master's of Public Administration Course Catalog.
- 1c. Deactivate INSS 5302 (Seminar in Intelligence and National Security) is a required course for the degree, but the course content is redundant with two other required courses: INSS 5304 (Intelligence and National Security Policy and Process) and INSS 5305 (Introduction to Intelligence Analysis). This proposal thus removes the 5302 course and the INSS 5302 prerequisite for INSS 5304, INSS 5305, INSS 5307, and INSS 5308. See Course Delete Form.
- 1d. With the removal of INSS 5302 from the required courses, we are requesting a change in the number of required electives from 18 to 15 hours and an increase in the number of free electives students can take from 15 to 18 for those pursuing the thesis option and from 18 to 21 for those in the non-thesis track. The total required hours for the MS INSS degree would remain the same at 39 hours.
- 2. INSS 5390 (Capstone)- Currently, all non-thesis track MS-INSS students must enroll in INSS 5390 as an independent study in the last semester of the program. The independent study format is overly labor-intensive for the 3 INSS faculty who must take these independent studies on without course credit toward their regular teaching load. As a

result, many students who enroll in Capstone as an independent study end up with an "Incomplete" (no grade) that delays their own graduation by as much as one year and further lessens the chances they will finish their degree.

Thus we are proposing 4 changes to INSS 5390 Capstone to structure as an organized course and increase graduation rates:

- 2a) To change the "schedule type" of this required course from "independent study" to "hybrid" and "Lecture". Changing the structure allows the MS-INSS students to have regular instructor feedback in a scheduled and organized fashion to also increase the chance of course completion. The instructor of record would work with students in a traditional classroom setting and monitor progress online.
- 2b) To cross-list the class with CRIJ 5390 (Capstone in Criminology and Criminal Justice) so that students from two graduate programs can enroll in the same class within the same department (NOTE: with the merger on August 1, 2019, both the INSS and the CCJ master's degrees are now in the same department). Cross-listing the class will serve the same goal for both degree programs, which will help with scheduling with limited faculty. This organized course could then count towards the instructor's teaching requirement and has the added bonus of being interdisciplinary.
- 2c) Change the course description: We propose deleting one sentence that requires students to take the class in their final semester. The change allows the student to take the course earlier than their last semester before graduation if necessary (such as for students who graduate in Summer or Fall).
- 2d) Addition of INSS 5300 as a prerequisite. INSS 5300 is a a research methods course that is necessary to have completed before enrolling in Capstone
- 3. The description of academic standards currently contradicts a statement in the degree plan concerning the required grade for required courses. Please see the attached addendum for proposed catalog changes to the wording of the curriculum.
- 4. Change acceptable prerequisites for INSS 5361 Applied Statistics. PAD 5300 and POLS 5300 both focus on public management research. INSS students are required to have the development of qualitative and quantitative research skills necessary to undertake intelligence work. Special attention is given to the distinct differences between intelligence research and social and behavioral science research. Acceptable prerequisite for INSS 5361 would be INSS 5300 as this course demonstrates critically how data is validated, systematically organized, and processed for a profession that has operational and information security requirements at its core.

The Master of Science in Intelligence and National Security Studies and the Graduate Certificate in Intelligence and National Security Studies (INSS) provide a highly-rigorous interdisciplinary graduate program intended for students seeking employment or career advancement in the United States Intelligence Community (IC). The INSS graduate program is also suitable for students interested in security-related jobs in the private sector such as applied research institutions (think tanks). The INSS graduate program is also ideal preparation for advanced graduate study at the doctoral level in international relations, political science, public administration, public policy, history, or other closely related fields. The INSS graduate curriculum focuses on specific intelligence and security competencies that are delivered across the spectrum of academic disciplines at The University of Texas at El Paso.

Admission Requirements for the Master of Science (MS)

- 1. Completion and submission of a graduate admissions application,
- 2. Submission of official transcripts in accordance with the requirements of the Graduate School.
- 3. A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
- 4. Demonstration of academic achievement and potential as indicated by the results of the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) or the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). This requirement is waived if the student already possesses an accredited graduate degree.
- A brief statement of purpose (1-2 pages) that addresses educational and career goals and reasons for pursuing the MS degree.

6. Three academic letters of recommendation from instructors who can evaluate the ability to succeed in a rigorous graduate program. A minimum of two letters of recommendation are required for students who have been out of school for two or more years. Letters of recommendation from employers or work supervisors are acceptable for applicants who have been out of school for five years or more.

Note: Admission packages are evaluated utilizing all of the requirements listed above.

Free Elective Requirement for the MS Degree

Students may also take appropriate graduate courses with the graduate advisor's approval from any university department or program (e.g., anthropology, business administration, history, linguistics, political science, women's studies, etc) and apply these courses toward the free elective requirement. Students may also develop, in consultation with their graduate advisor, (9) hours toward a concentration within a single academic discipline such as economics, plubic administration, or geographic information systems or develop a multidisciplinary concentration such as homeland security, international security, or area/regional studies. These are just a few examples of possible student concentrations. Up to six (6) hours of approved cultural studies coursework (travel/study abroad) may be applied to the free elective requirement. Likewise, students can apply up to six (6) hours of an approved security studies internship toward the degree.

Academic Standards

Students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better in order to earn the MS degree. MS students must also earn a grade of B or better in all Core-Required Courses and in the thesis or capstone course(s) to be eligible for graduation. <a href="Students must earn at least a "C" in all courses and at least a "B" in all required courses. Students will be given only one opportunity to retake a failed course that earned a "C" grade or lower (or a "B" grade or lower in a Required Course). Students with a semester GPA below 3.0 will be placed on academic probation. Students will have enly one nine credit hours-semester to return to "good" academic standing with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Those students failing to return to good academic standing after one semesternine credit hours may be dismissed from the program-Graduate-School and the MS degree program.
