Proposal Title: Revised Course Description and Reduced Prerequisites for CRIJ 4309

CRIJ 4309 Internship in Crim Just I course description needs to be updated to reflect our existing internship requirements and reduced number of hours the student spends at an agency. Agencies are now more flexible to accommodate working students. These requirements have been in existence for years, so with these changes, the catalog will be consistent with current practice.

CRIJ 4309 is incorrectly listed as a "Lecture" class when it is (and always has been) off-campus at an agency, so the TYPE of contact hours need to be changed to "Other Hours." The number of contact hours remains at 3.

Meeting all 5 prerequisites have shown to be a barrier for internship enrollment numbers, so we are reducing the number of courses with a "C" or above from 5 down to 1, and requiring that the student be a junior or senior.

Rationale for changing the course:

Course description needs to be updated to reflect our existing internship requirements and reduced number of hours the student spends at an agency. Schedules now allow the student for more flexibility. The class is incorrectly listed as "Lecture" class when it is (and always has been) off-campus-- more like a "Practicum." Meeting all 5 prerequisites has shown to be a barrier for enrollment numbers, so we are instead reducing the number of courses with a "C" or above from 5 down to 1, and have specified a classification of Junior or Senior with a minimum GPA for the major.
