CRIJ 4310 Internship in Crim Just II The course description needs to be updated to reflect our existing internship requirements and reduced number of hours the student spends at an agency. Schedules now allow the student for more flexibility. These requirements have been in existence for years, so with these changes, the catalog will be consistent with current practice.

A "B" or above in CRIJ 4309 is required to maintain positive agency relationships. The pool of applicants is competitive enough for 4310 that CJ agencies do not want students who perform average/at a "C" level in the first semester to return to their agency for another semester. They only want the better students to return.

Second part of the internship program in which the student spends time each week at a criminal justice agency or related organization that has been pre-approved through the Internship Coordinator and the agency. This course expands on the experience and knowledge gained in CRIJ 4309, provides an opportunity to build a professional network and increase the chance of getting hired after graduation.
