Proposal Title: New Course DANC 4349

- an assessment of the professionalizing needs of our BFA in Dance students

we want to strengthen and broaden the skill set of our dance students by offering a 4000 level in Hip Hop dance.

Differently from DANC 3349, DANC 4349 is a class conceived for dance majorsin particular students pursuing the BFA in Dance,– and for students with a solid background in Hip Hop dance practice. DANC 4349 will further expand the students technique, physicality, artistry, vocabulary, and versatility in Hip Hop, with a particular focus on emerging and current global trends. Differently from DANC 3349, DANC 4349 is predominantly devoted to technical and performance training. In DANC 4349, students will need to master the specific technical details of different hip hop styles, matching the standards of the professional dance world and, in case, the knowledge required to access graduate programs in dance.

DANC 4349 Hip Hop Dance 2 offers an advanced class in hip hop dance, with a specific emphasis on technical mastery and performance proficiency in a variety of specific global and diasporic Hip Hop dance styles. This course is particularly crucial for the professional development of students pursuing the BFA in Dance. While the existing 3000level hip hop class emphasizes foundational cultural and technical aspects, a higher level focused on technique and performance is necessary to form competitive and deeply knowledgeable professionals in the field of dance.

## **Course Description:**

DANC 4349 is an advanced Hip Hop dance class that emphasizes the mastery of technical and performance aspects in a variety of global Hip Hop dance styles: from Old School, through House, its Afro-Latiné legacies and Locking, up to the most current diasporic trends. The course engages Hip Hop dance in its urban forms as well as in its theatrical developments.

There will be a strong focus on movement technique and on the expression of foundational and specific Hip Hop dance principles, aesthetics, and philosophies. The course also emphasizes the embodied analysis and awareness of identitarian aspects at the core of the dance form in its performative manifestation.

Students will be encouraged to find their personal artistic voice while moving and thinking collaboratively, employing choreography as well as improvisational skills according to the specific styles at stake.

The goal of this course is to understand Hip Hop dance and culture more clearly and with a professional or pre-professional level of proficiency in relation to one's own body and journey.

Enrollment in DANC 4349 requires Departmental approval. DANC 3349 is a prerequisite for students pursuing a BFA in Dance.

# Learning Objectives:

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY: To exercise personal and collective responsibility in technical training as a dance artist and professional peer, and to manifest it as part of the philosophy of Hip Hop as a social practice.

GLOBAL AWARENESS: To theoretically acknowledge and performatively embody and manifest the multiple, historical and diasporic legacies of Hip Hop as a social, political, and aesthetically-complex dance practice and social tool.

CRITICAL THINKING: To connect details in movement to the cultural and philosophical ideas that shape a specific Hip Hop style. This implies an idea of critical thinking as relational.

CONFIDENCE: To master consistency in training, clarity and focus-both mental and physical, while deepening the understanding and awareness of isolations and energy (among other aspects) in dance movement.

LEADERSHIP: To master personal and corporeal initiative and sense of advocacy for oneself and for the social, political, and aesthetic relevance of Hip Hop.

TEAMWORK: To collaboratively plan, rehearse, and share choreographic and improvisational performances through group explorations and research. Students must contribute equally to the research, development, planning and presentation of the assignment.

# **Learning Goals:**

To accurately perform in detail a variety of Hip Hop styles.

To honor individuality through the commitment to collective performance.

To manifest in performance the impact of historical events, social circumstances, and political landscapes on hip hop practices.

To demonstrate in practice how Hip-Hop dance reflects or challenges social and cultural norms and ideals.

To consciously honor the legacies of Hip Hop without appropriating and recognizing its innovative developments internationally and in popular dance forms.
