**Proposal Title: Change of 8 Dance Courses' Titles** 

The UTEP Dance Faculty proposes to change the title of eight dance courses in the UTEP Catalog, so that the title changes will also appear in the degree plans of the BFA in Dance, BA in Dance, and Minor in Dance. Note that such modifications do not alter the current content of the classes or the rotation of classes.

As Kulkarnia and Vinuales (2020) argue, course titles are instrumental in manifesting the perceived value of a course and in enrollment rates. As award-winning higher ed dance educator Nyama McCarthy-Brown (2014) suggests, the process that leads to full accessibility to dance—fundamental in our open-access institution—goes through the progressive undoing of epistemic barriers in theory and practice. We have identified such barriers in the way some of our courses are designated.

The goals of this proposal are:

- To clarify for the students the actual content of the classes (favoring enrollment for upper-level courses and better engaging our majors);
- To clarify for the students how specific courses offer specific levels of expertise (levels);
- To decolonize the language in the course titles to mirror the praxis of our pedagogy. We believe this proposal is necessary for further actualizing our ongoing plan to elevate the Dance Program in line with R1 standards and in service of our student population and future recruitment.

The term "appreciation" as in Dance Appreciation has been heavily contested in Dance Studies discourses, for it suggests an aesthetic relation with dance from the audience perspective. Historically, "dance appreciation" has been associated to the teaching of Eurocentric concert forms, with only an "acknowledgment" of non-Western and non-theatrical forms and their social aspects. In line with the UTEP "Reimangine Core," we prefer a class title that manifests its intent to critically introduce students to dance in its multifarious processes, practices, contexts, and impacts.

The current title suggests that the relevant study of dance history is limited to its consideration "as a performance art," which commonly encompasses only Western and concert forms, excluding, for instance, the history of social dancing and more current trends like digital dance. This title doesn't reflect the deeper historical, and historiographic study of dance we offer as an R1 institution with a commitment to analysis and critical thinking. We also want to highlight the plurality of narratives and experiences by pluralizing "history" into "histories."

We propose a new title that mirrors our intent of acknowledging the transformation of dance in relation to globalization.
