Proposal Title: Degree plan changes for English & American Literature major

The literature faculty would like to propose two changes to the degree plan for English & American Literature. These changes will allow more flexibility in the major, particularly in light of the requirements imposed by Senate Bill 25. Moreover, these changes will allow students to tailor their programs better to fit their research and professional goals.

First, we would allow a maximum of two 2000-level courses to count toward the major. Currently the major does not allow <u>any</u> 2000-level courses, which is out of line with most COLA programs. The current policy creates unnecessary difficulties for our students, especially transfer students, who in most cases must fit all 36 credit-hours in the major within their last two years of study.

Second, we would remove the "Additional Area" requirement which requires students to complete 3 courses in one of five areas (e.g., British Literature before 1800). While this requirement was originally designed to encourage specialization, it does not do so in practice and even prevents students from developing more meaningful specializations. The requirement also creates unnecessary scheduling difficulties which we have until now managed by allowing substitutions.
