Proposal Title: Graduate Course Changes (ENGL 5339, 5341, 5342, 5345)

We are retitling and adjusting the descriptions of four graduate courses in English Education (ENGL 5339, 5341, 5345, and and 5342) to better match the needs of our graduate students.
