Proposal Title: Linguistics Major Changes

The program has undergone several changes related to faculty retirement and hire of new faculty. With all current TT professors in the department specializing in different aspects of bilingualism, a title change needs to be implemented to show the greater focus on bilingualism and a lesser focus on theoretical linguistics. This refocusing will better reflect the expertise of the current Linguistics faculty, address the needs of UTEP students (thus increasing enrollment), and meet the strategic goal of the University to be one of the leading American institutions in research on bilingualism.

First, we propose changing the name of the major from 'Linguistics' to 'Linguistics and Bilingualism'. We believe that adding the word 'bilingualism' to the name of the major will attract students, which will help us increase the number of majors in our program. Most students are unaware of what linguistics is, and that has always been a challenge when it comes to recruiting.

Second, we propose restructuring the core and electives' section of the major, with students being required to take foundational linguistics courses and also courses that have a focus on bilingualism (see Degree Plan Changes document attached).

Third, we propose revised names for some of the courses we offer. Some of the updated course names reflect the change of the program's focus, for example, adding the word 'bilingualism' to the Sociolinguistics course, much of which focuses on bilingualism. Other changes simply remove unnecessary words in the titles, for example removing the word 'an' from 'An Introduction to Linguistics' (see course change forms attached).

Lastly, we propose updating the description of some of our courses. Most of the course description changes are made to reflect the bilingualism focus of the program (see Course Change forms attached). In some cases, like Introduction to Linguistics, the new description provides clearer information of what the course is about, which would help us get more students to enroll in the course (see course change forms attached).
