Proposal Title: Change in Pedagogy Requirements for Bachelor of Music

In 2017, the Department of Music underwent its periodic re-accreditation process with the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM). As a result of this process, which included an on-campus visit from NASM evaluators, the department has been asked to make several revisions to the Bachelor of Music (MUSC) degree. One of these revisions concerns the pedagogy course(s), a.k.a. Secondary Instruction, which the following students will be required to take:

- 1. Students with the Instrumental Concentration (ALMI) and the All-Levels Education Minor (ALED)
- 2. Students with the Performance: Winds/Strings/Percussion (MWSP) concentration

In the past, students who played a brass instrument, for example, and were planning a career as a band director, would take two woodwinds courses and a percussion course. If the student played trumpet, it was assumed he or she could teach trumpet and the other brass instruments as well, including horn, trombone, and tuba. NASM recommends that we no longer make any such assumption, and require brass players to take a pedagogy class in brass, percussionists to take a class in percussion, etc. In other words, in the future, students will be required to take a pedagogy class that includes the students' primary instrument. We are proposing revisions to the Catalog copy in these two concentrations to reflect this change. These revisions can be accomplished without changing the total number of hours in these degree plans.

Students in the Keyboard Pedagogy (MUKP), Keyboard Performance (MUSK), Guitar Performance (MUPG), and Vocal Performance (MUSV) Concentrations, and in the Vocal (ALMV) Concentration with the All-Levels Education Minor (ALED) already take their respective Pedagogy courses. No Pedagogy classes are required in the Music Theory & Composition Concentration (MTAC) or in the Bachelor of Music Degree in Commercial Music (CMUS).
