Proposal Title: Revising curriculum for Legal Psychology concentration

A number of changes are requested to the doctoral program in psychology, Legal Psychology concentration:

- 1. Addition of Seminar in Psychopathology (PSYC 6309) to list of possible breadth courses. This will allow students more flexibility in completing their degree and better align the content of the breadth courses with students' research interests.
- 2. Reduction of number of breadth courses from three to two. The faculty in the Legal program believe that two courses in this area are sufficient to provide students with the needed basis in general psychology. Further, these courses are offered infrequently and the courses that have been available did not align well with students' needs. Reducing the number of courses to two will eliminate barriers to degree completion.
- 3. Clarification of concentration courses. The catalog did not reflect the faculty's intent with regard to which specialized Legal Psychology courses students take. Rather than providing a list from which students could select any courses from, we have clarified that PSYC 6344 is required of all students, and PSYC 6342 (which can be taken multiple times) and PSYC 6346 can be used to fulfil the remaining concentration courses. We have also added an additional course to this requirement (from 3 to 4) to ensure that students receive enough training in Legal Psychology issues.
- 4. Removal of Field Placement from Concentration Requirement. Traditionally, all students were required to complete a field placement, which is a supervised research externship. This worked well for many years, but recent changes have made this requirement less than ideal. First, many of our current students seek teaching-focused positions and such a placement is not helpful to them. Second, there is currently a limited number of faculty (one) who can supervise these placements, placing a large burden on faculty to supervise these time-intensive placements. Finally, the placements available in recent years have not always been aligned with students' research interests, forcing students to complete 300 hour externships in settings where they are exposed to limited learning opportunities. Making Field Placement an option instead of a requirement will allow students to better tailor their degree to their career goals.

5. Resctructure of Concentration Electives. To better align the degree program with the goals of the program, we have restructured the Concentration Electives to focus on courses that offer students practical skills. This includes the now-optional Field Placement in addition to other applied courses, such as those that focus on writing or statistics. We have eliminated other courses from this section of the degree plan to ensure that all students receive some degree of applied training. The courses removed from this section are still available to students under the Psychology Electives section of the degree plan.

6. Course removals/additions. We have removed references to courses that are no longer offered, and added courses that were added to the catalog in recent years.
