Proposal Title: Updated degree plans for psychology graduate programs of study

The Department of Psychology has made a number of primarily cosmetic changes to our degree plans for the purposes of 1) providing consistency in format across degree plans within our program, 2) providing clarity for our students about which courses count in the menu of elective/options, and 3) to reduce the time it takes for course substitutions to be processed through Goldmine thus limiting the issues with financial aid students face during registration.

Some changes were consistent across all plans of study and are itemized below:

Degree plans of study for the Doctoral Degree in Psychology with a concentration in Health Psychology; Social/Cultural Psychology; Legal Psychology; Bilingualism, Language & Cognition; and Behavioral Neuroscience as well as the degree plan of study for the Masters Degree in Clinical Psychology have been updated to include:

- the use of the 6000 level course number instead of the 5000 level numbers whenever possible per the Graduate School's suggestion
- PSYC 6313 Multilevel Modeling course number changed, but the old number was still on our older degree plans so this has been updated in all locations
- an older typographical error in one degree plan for the course number PSYC 6343 Clinical Issues in Legal Psychology has been corrected
- for all degree plans, students can take PSYC 5385 or 6385 Research Apps, PSYC 5396/6396 Thesis II and PSYC 6399 Dissertation II multiple times, but can only take PSYC 5395/6395 Thesis I and PSYC 6398 Dissertation I once for credit. This was not previously specified and is clear now in all plans.
- PSYC 5360 Clinical Internship and PSYC 6390 Field Placement courses are now clearly described in terms of whether or not they can be taken more than once in some degree plans for credit.
- PSYC 6380 and 6381 correspond to First Year Project, and since an academic year can never really be more than "two semesters" these courses cannot be taken more than one

time each for credit in all doctoral degree plans. Therefore these courses have been removed from some elective sections in a few degree plans.

-Some programs of study have indicated that students can repeat specific Special Topic or Seminar courses more than once, since the topics do vary for these courses. When this is true, it has been specified on each degree plan.

Additionally, within some programs of study more specific and unique changes were incorporated and are summarized below:

-In the plan of study for the Doctoral Degree in Psychology with a concentration in Bilingualism, Language & Cognition, the faculty voted to move PSYC 6334 Foundations of Research out of a required course menu and into two other locations within the degree plan. Specifically, this course is now included as a breadth option and as an elective option. Additionally, this degree plan has been expanded to include a wider range of breadth courses options for students to take, and a larger list of elective courses to take.

-In the plan of study for the Doctoral Degree in Psychology with a concentration in Behavioral Neuroscience, the faculty voted to move PSYC 6334 Foundations of Research out of a required course menu and into the elective section. Additionally previously approved changes related to which courses count as breadth or electives were not included in the online degree plan in the catalog and have been correctly included now.

-In the plan of study for the Doctoral Degree in Psychology with a concentration in Health Psychology, faculty voted to expand the list of courses offered for elective and breadth options. Additionally the area moved a previously required cross-cultural research methods course into the electives section due to a lack of frequency with which it was being taught. Additionally, this area has reduced the total number of required concentration courses from 3 to 2 based on the frequency with which they are able to teach one of those original 3 courses (that course was not taught for 5 years so making it required became problematic for students). The faculty in this area have adjusted the elective number to account for the total number of credit hours such that there is no change in required number of courses.

-in the plan of study for the Masters in Clinical Psychology, the faculty voted to combine two older sections of their degree plan into one larger elective menu to provide more options for students to take, and to include courses that are required for students to obtain state licensure in psychological counseling. This elective section has been expanded, but in doing so - the faculty also identified a course which is no longer being taught and asked to remove it from their plan. That was PSYC 6319 Seminar in Personality Assessment, which has now been removed from the Clinical MA program of study as well as the Doctoral Degree in Psychology with a Legal Psychology Concentration Degree plan, and we are including a course deletion form in this packet.

Finally, we are including the track changes version of the catalog listing from the UTEP website that is required for LACC review, but we are also including some internal (departmental) documents outlining each degree plan, as these versions are the ones that will be used to help guide our students on how to select courses for their degree. We believe these new internal documents will reduce the number of issues our students face

when it comes to registering for courses each semester, since this reformatting is now more clear and consistent across degree plans. We have taken the steps to confirm that the internal documents match the course catalog website changes. We feel that our internal formatting might be a bit easier to read, and thought the LACC committee and other evaluative groups might therefore also benefit from seeing the internal files alongside the track change versions; however, we understand that the formal review will be of the track changes version which is copy and pasted from the course catalog.

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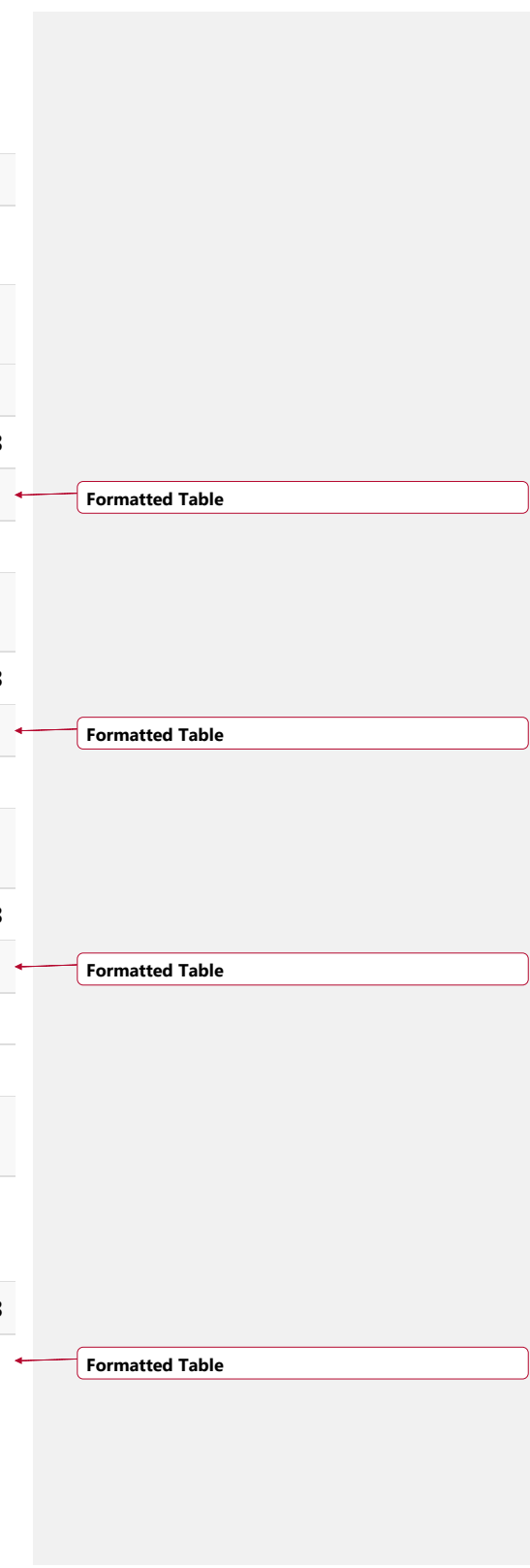

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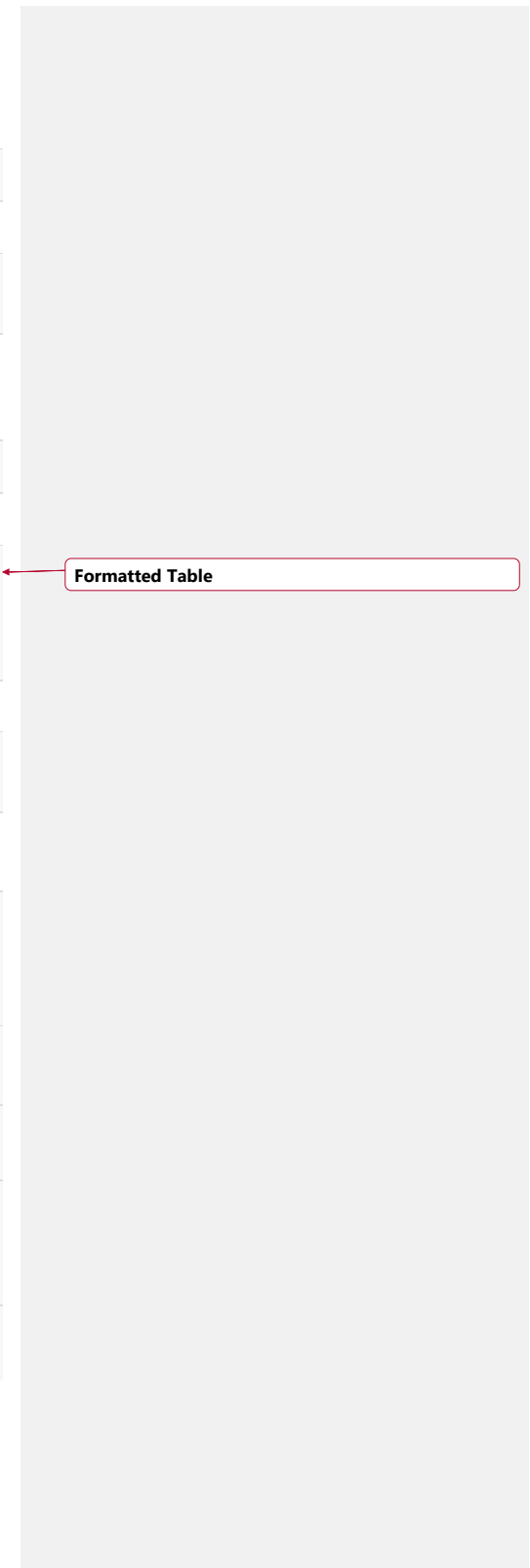

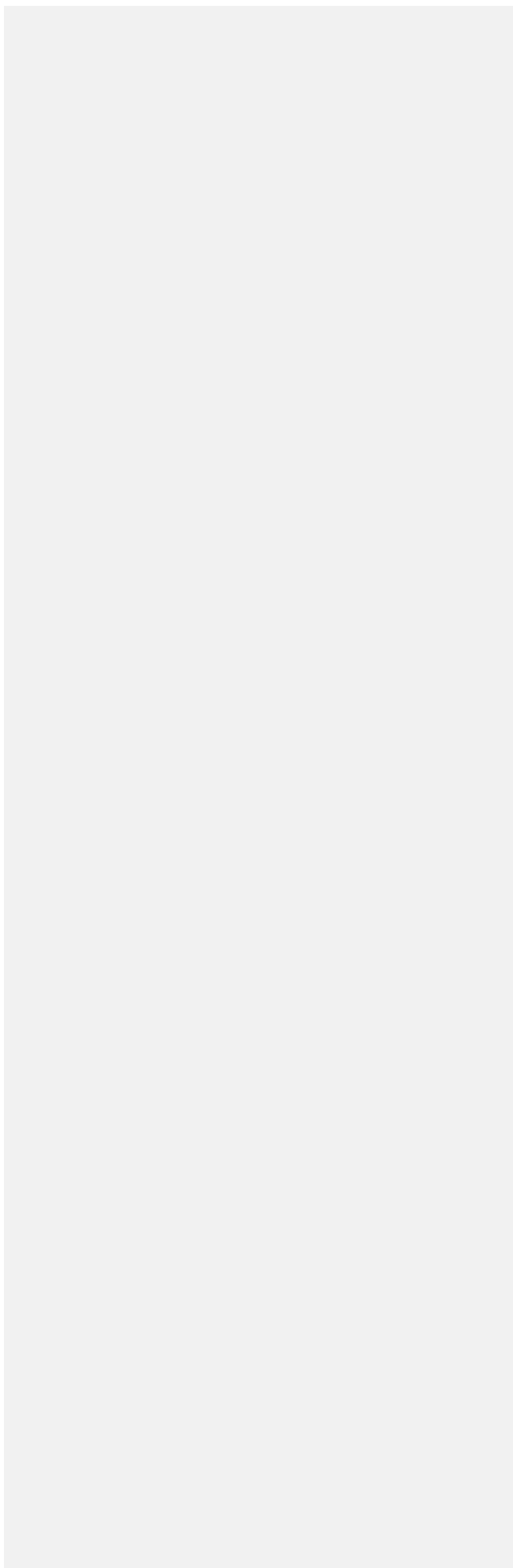
