Proposal Title: Reduction of Course Credit Requirements for Psychology Doctoral Degree

Given the University's new tuition remission policies the Department of Psychology wishes to reduce the total number of required credit hours for completion of a PhD in Psychology. The primary goal is to streamline the expense of obtaining a PhD in Psychology at UTEP, by reducing redundancies and elective credits, while not compromising the integrity and rigor of our program. The proposal includes edits to existing degree plans of study (e.g., trimming of total credit hours primarily through elective course offerings) along with a minor modification of milestones to allow more flexibility across different areas of concentration to facilitate research productivity in line with field-specific needs in the more applied areas of psychology (health and legal psychology) as compared to the more basic science areas of psychology (behavioral neuroscience; bilingualism, language and cognition; and social/cultural psychology). Within this proposal, the degree plans are being truncated from the original 78 credit hours down to 60-66 (with some variance across area of concentration), and the first milestone of our program is being amended to become flexible to either remain as is (a first year project that requires course enrollments and a formal presentation) or be replaced by a comprehensive examination or systematic review in the more applied concentration area of legal psychology. These changes will benefit our students in three ways. First the overall cost of tuition will be reduced significantly, allowing for tuition remission programs to stretch further to cover expenses and reduce out of pocket costs for students. Second, the adjustment in reduction of elective hours will result in students having more time in later years of the program for research in the laboratory. Lastly, the modification to our first programmatic milestone will facilitate more flexibility for the applied areas of psychology (e.g., our legal psychology concentration) to assess comprehensive knowledge in a reasonable time frame, without removing the option for current approaches (first year project) that work well for the more basic science areas of concentration. Below are more specific details about our proposed changes:

1) Course Credit Hour Reduction

Our Psychology PhD Program currently requires 78 credit hours which includes a large number of elective slots across a number of areas of concentration. After recently comparing our program to other programs across the country, we learned that 78 credit hours is on the higher end. Further, the minimum number of credit hours needed for a doctoral degree at UTEP is 60. Recently, UTEP through the graduate school began providing tuition remission to doctoral students using a 60 credit hour degree model. Given this model, programs with more than 60 credit hours end up with a situation that negatively impacts students (a larger portion of tuition comes out of pocket for them, than for students in programs with 60 credit hour degree plans). In response to the above, the Psychology Department would like to reduce the total number of credit hours substantially for our 5 concentrations to between 60-66 credit hours (the range is due to some areas being more applied than others, and wanting to retain additional course flexibility for students in the elective section). Specifically the following concentrations have reduced the degree plans to 60 credit hours: behavioral neuroscience; bilingualism, language and cognition; social/cultural psychology and legal psychology. The health psychology concentration will retain 66 credit hours since students in this area of concentration often transfer in masters degrees, and retaining elective slots allows for more flexible transfer of credits.

2) Milestone Modification

For our doctoral program in psychology, students currently have to complete several milestones in addition to course credits. These are listed in the milestones agreement form linked here: https://www.utep.edu/graduate/_files/docs/admission-andenrollment/milestones/gpsy_milestones.pdf and also briefly outlined below. The faculty in the legal psychology area of concentration have expressed challenges related to the first year project milestone, which is difficult to complete due to the more longitudinal nature of the research conducted in this area of psychology. It is not feasible for this area to complete a project within the time frame that would result in a publishable data set. However, faculty do feel that they can replace this project with either a systematic review or comprehensive examination such that students can benefit from the milestone without being negatively impacted by the time constraint need for it to fit into the first year. To allow for this flexibility we propose to amend our milestones in the following way outlined below. This will result in areas of concentration having flexibility to guide students into a path that best fits the research in that particular area, to yield the most productive results for students. The options for the first milestone will either be: 1) completion of a first year project which involves two course enrollments, and a presentation to the Department by Fall during their second year 2) writing of a systematic review in line with the field of study of the masters or dissertation project that would be completed by the start of the student's 4th year in the program or 3) pass a comprehensive examination focused on specific arearelevant content in psychology that would be done by the start of a student's 4th year in the program.

Preliminary Milestone: First Year Project (completed by year 2)

Milestone 2: Masters Thesis (completed before the start of year 4)

Milestone 3: Dissertation Proposal approved (typically during year 4-5)

Milestone 4: Doctoral Candidacy (typically during year 4-5)

Final Milestone: Doctoral Dissertation (completed by the end of year 6-7)

New Proposed Milestones:

Preliminary Milestone (students can either complete a first year project by the end of year 2, conduct a systematic review by the end of year 4, or pass a comprehensive exam by the end of year 4)

Milestone 2: Masters Thesis (completed before the start of year 4)

Milestone 3: Dissertation Proposal approved (typically during year 4-5)

Milestone 4: Doctoral Candidacy (typically during year 4-5)
