Rationale: THEA 3314, Acting for the Camera, is appropriate for inclusion as a Fine Arts Block Elective because it provides advanced, practice-based study of acting as a performing art, with a specific focus on performance for film, television, and other screen media.

The course builds upon foundational acting training and requires students to apply both basic and advanced acting techniques to camera-based performance. Students develop artistic and technical skills through direct performance exercises that reproduce professional situations found in commercials, television, and film. By performing on camera and critically reviewing their work during playback sessions, students learn to evaluate and refine elements such as characterization, physical and vocal expression, emotional communication, timing, focus, and the adaptation of performance choices to the camera.

The course therefore combines creative practice, artistic interpretation, performance, and critical self-evaluation, all of which are central to study in the Fine Arts. Its emphasis on the relationship between the performer and the camera also introduces students to the distinctive aesthetic and technical demands of screen acting compared with live theatrical performance.

As an upper-division course requiring previous acting preparation, THEA 3314 provides substantive and advanced engagement with theatrical and screen performance. Its inclusion as a Fine Arts Block Elective would allow multidisciplinary students with the appropriate prerequisites and departmental approval to incorporate advanced study of performance and screen-based artistic expression into their interdisciplinary degree plans.
