Proposal Title: Requiring a Grade of C or Better in INSS 3302

Rationale for Requiring a Grade of C or Better in INSS 3302

The proposed change establishes a requirement that students earn a grade of C or better in INSS 3302 in order for the course to count toward completion of the Interdisciplinary Studies (INSS) minor.

This change aligns the minor requirements with existing course prerequisites. INSS 3302 serves as a prerequisite for upper-division courses within the minor, and those courses already require students to have earned a grade of C or better in INSS 3302 before enrolling. As a result, a student who earns a grade of D in INSS 3302 technically receives passing credit under university policy, but is unable to progress through the minor because the prerequisite requirement for subsequent courses has not been met.

The absence of a clearly stated “C or better” requirement in the minor creates confusion for students and advisors and may delay timely degree completion. In addition, because a grade of D is considered passing for most upper-division coursework under university policy, students who need to repeat INSS 3302 to satisfy prerequisite requirements may encounter challenges with registration and financial aid processes that are designed around the assumption that the course has already been successfully completed.

By explicitly requiring a grade of C or better in INSS 3302 within the minor requirements, the program will provide greater transparency, improve advising accuracy, align the catalog with existing prerequisite standards, and ensure that students possess the foundational knowledge necessary for success in advanced coursework. This change will also eliminate inconsistencies between program requirements and course prerequisites, thereby supporting student progression and degree completion.
