

Minor Degree Plan for English and American Literature

Guidelines: **18 hours minimum.** All Literature students must take at least three hours in early British Literature (2311 is acceptable); three hours in late British Literature (2312 is acceptable); and three hours in upper-division American Literature (2313 is **NOT** acceptable). The other nine hours may be any 3300-4300 level literature classes.
