

# Robert Clayton 2023 SCHOLARSHIP

The Texas Pharmacy Foundation (TPF) offers the Robert Clayton Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to a student pursuing a career in pharmacy at an accredited Texas school or college of pharmacy.

### Background

Robert Clayton was a consultant pharmacist and Certified Diabetes Educator who died in a tragic car accident on his way to an American Pharmacists Association conference. Robert was very engaged in the profession at the state and national level. Robert was an active leader in the Texas Pharmacy Association and the then 'Section' of Consultant Pharmacists. This scholarship was established to encourage students to pursue the ideals exhibited by Robert during his time in our profession, including holding his resident patients' interest above all else; working to ensure his patients' medications were the safest, most appropriate, most effective, and used correctly; and taking responsibility to review, prevent, and solve medication-related problems to avoid further complications and maintain his patients' quality of life.

### **Eligibility Criteria**

To be eligible for the Robert Clayton Scholarship, a pharmacy student must be enrolled in an accredited Texas College of Pharmacy and entering their second (P2), third (P3) or fourth (P4) professional year in the fall of 2023 with a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 in required courses. In addition, the applicant must be a student member of the Texas Pharmacy Association (TPA) and demonstrate an interest in the practice of consultant pharmacy in long-term care, assisted living or MHMR facilities, or pharmacy practice primarily involving the treatment of geriatric patients.

Applicants should also demonstrate interest by listing participation in electives, rotations, internships, employment or volunteer work in the practice of consultant pharmacy in long-term care, assisted living or MHMR facilities, or pharmacy practice primarily involving the treatment of geriatric patients. Selection will be based on financial need, interest in consultant pharmacy practice and the potential to become a leader for Texas pharmacy, as demonstrated by involvement in pharmacy school and community activities.

- 2. Current CV/resume.
- 3. Letter of recommendation from a Texas pharmacist (such as a faculty member, preceptor, or supervisor).
