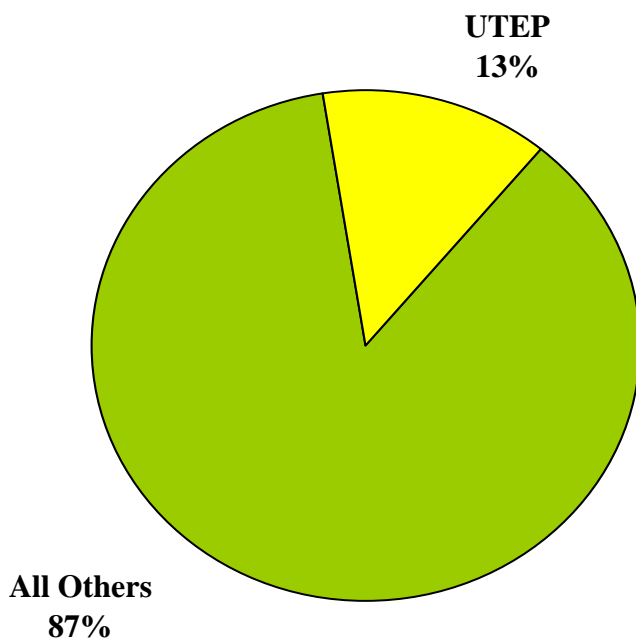

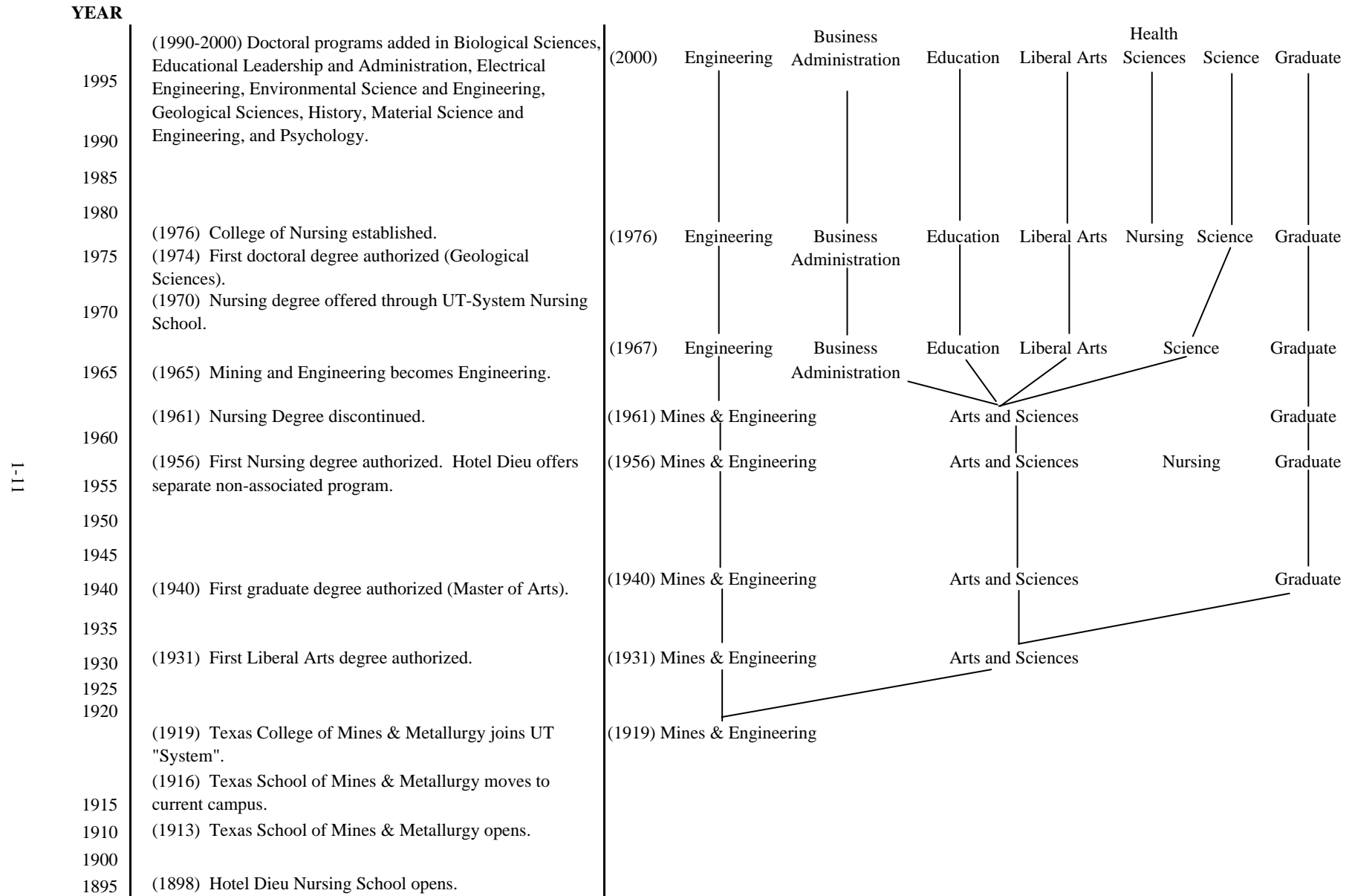

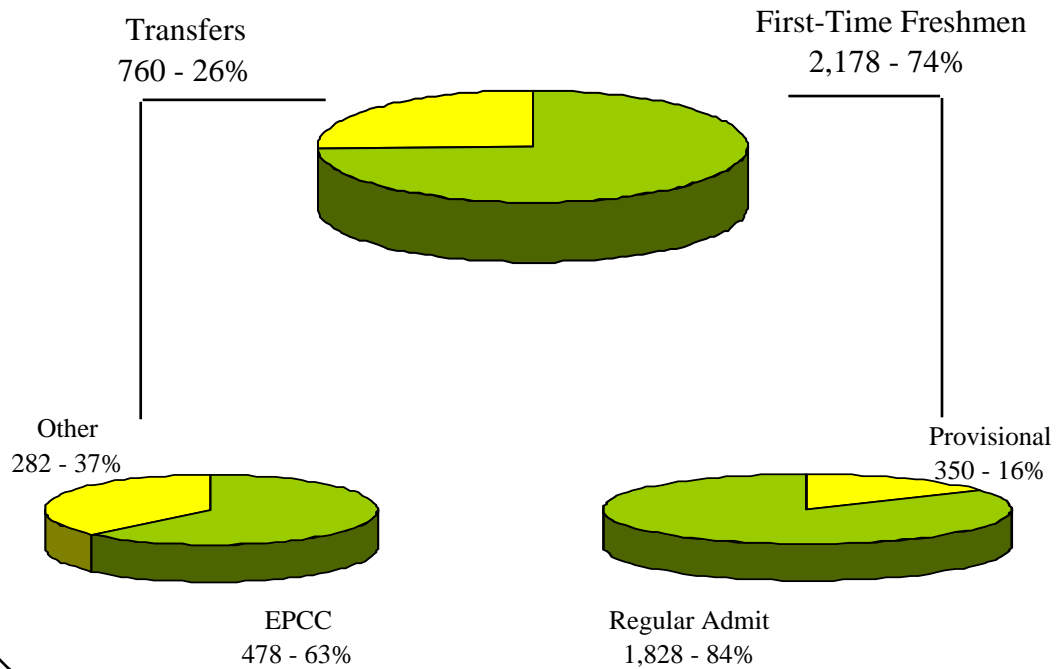

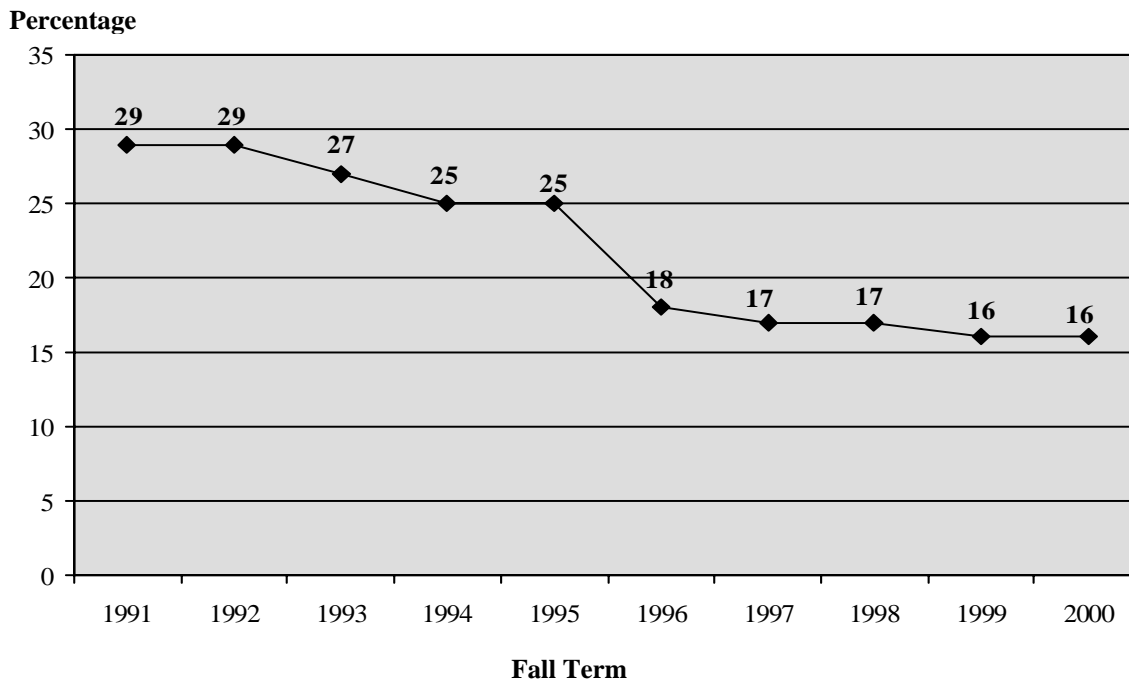
### Entering Status of New Students Fall 2000

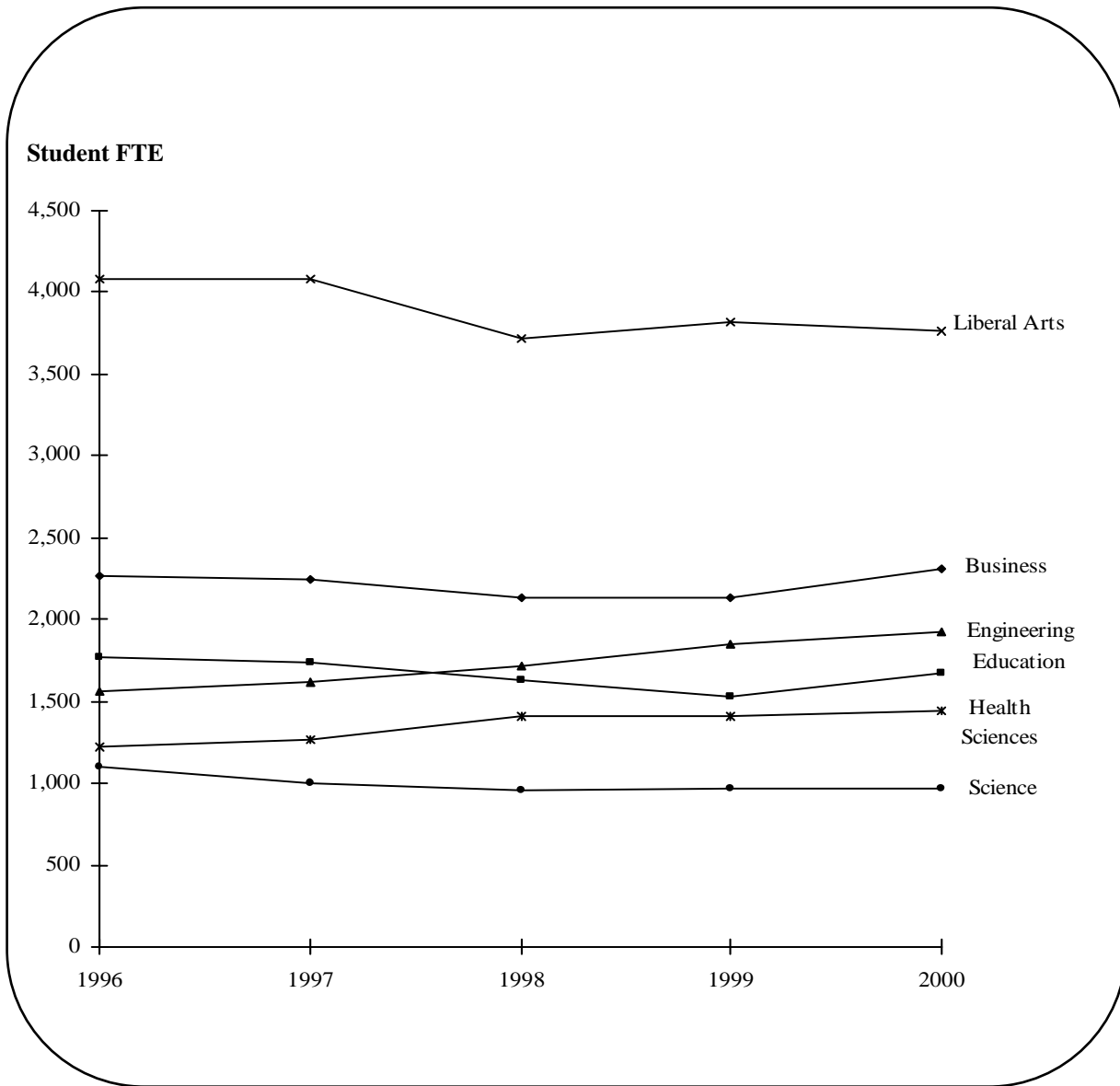

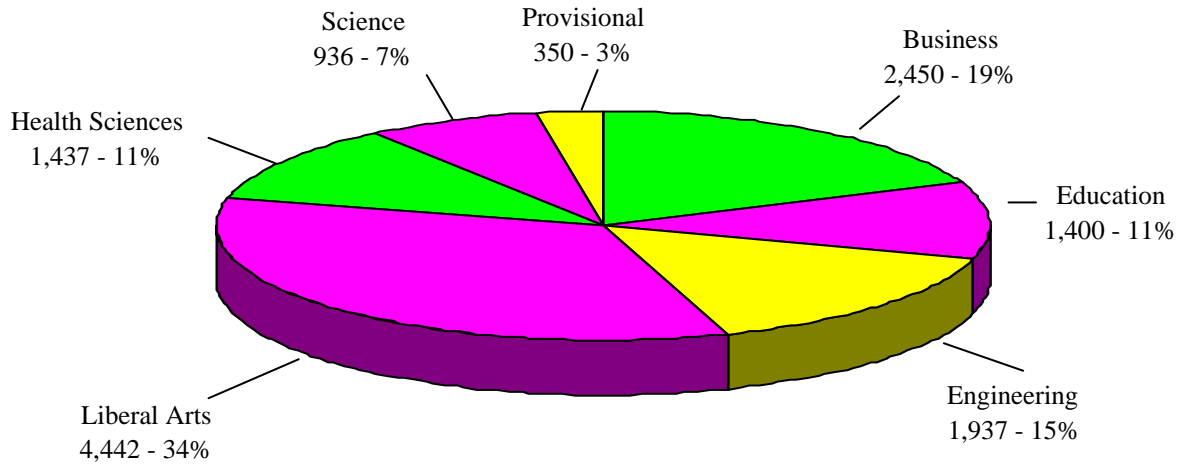

## Total Student Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)

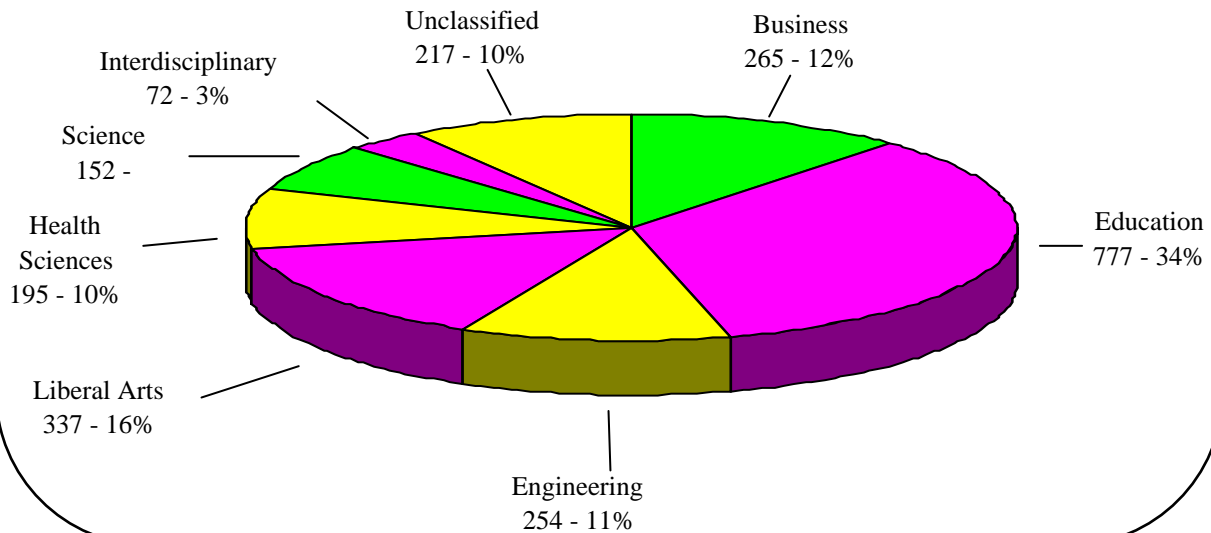

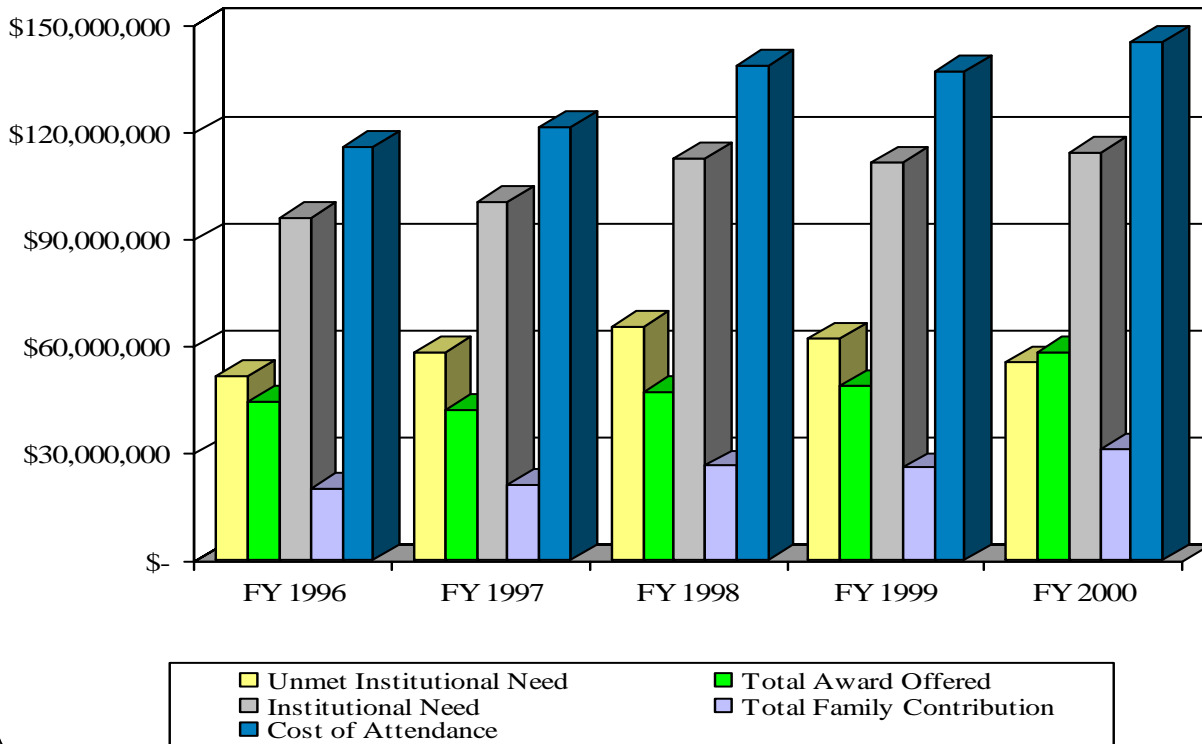

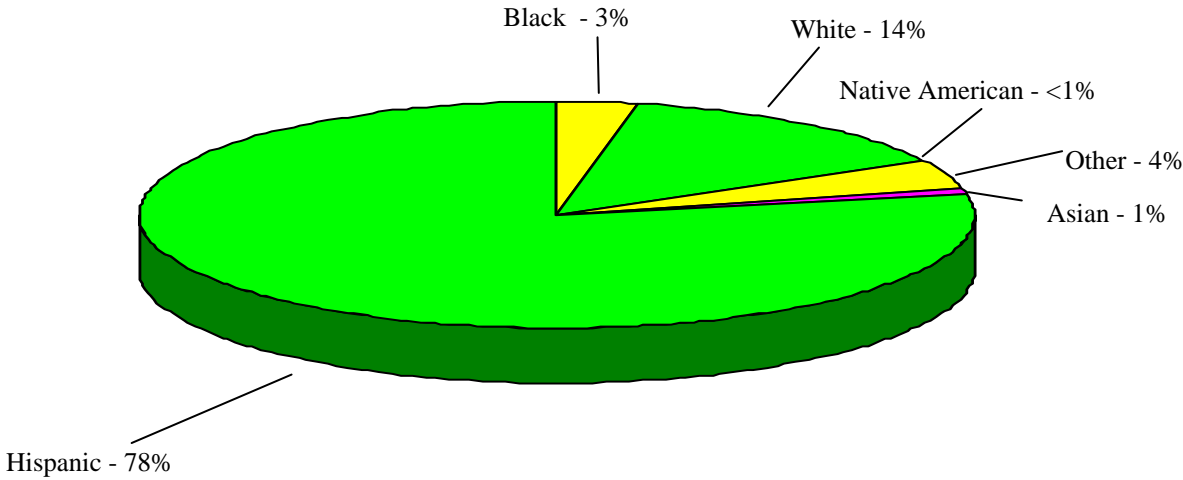

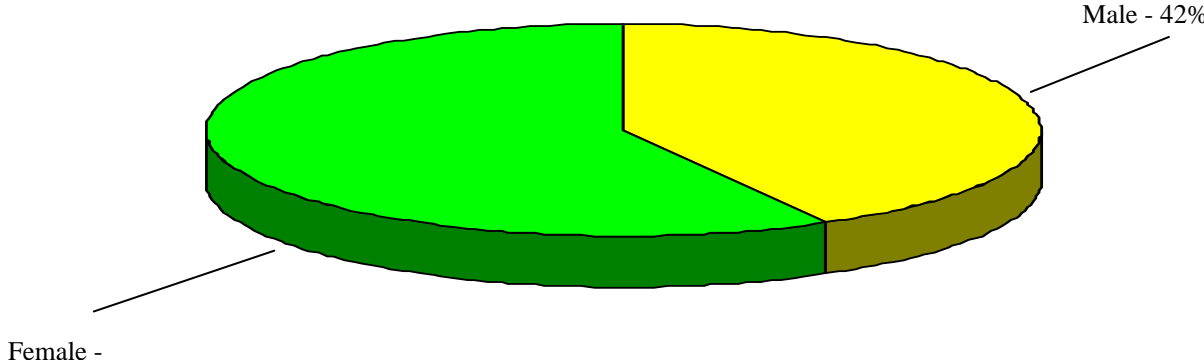

- **Placement in Developmental Education Courses:** State Law requires that every student who fails any one of the three sections of the basic college skills exam will be placed into developmental courses until the student passes that specific section, thereby
- **UTEP Courses:** *The courses in italics are currently offered at UTEP.* Previous courses have been modified and renumbered in response to state policy changes.
- **Enrollment for Different Reasons:** The table includes first-time entering students affected by the TASP mandate, i.e., they are required by state legislative mandate to participate in remediation as a result of their placement examination scores in mathem

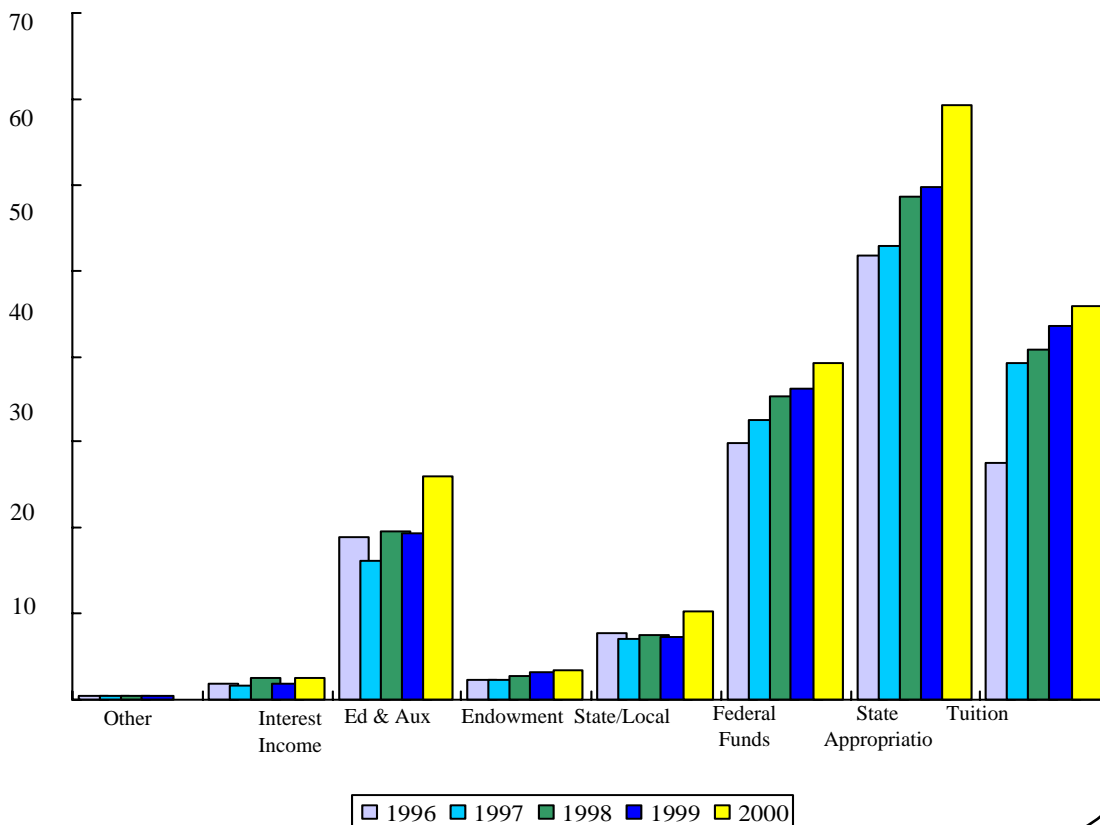

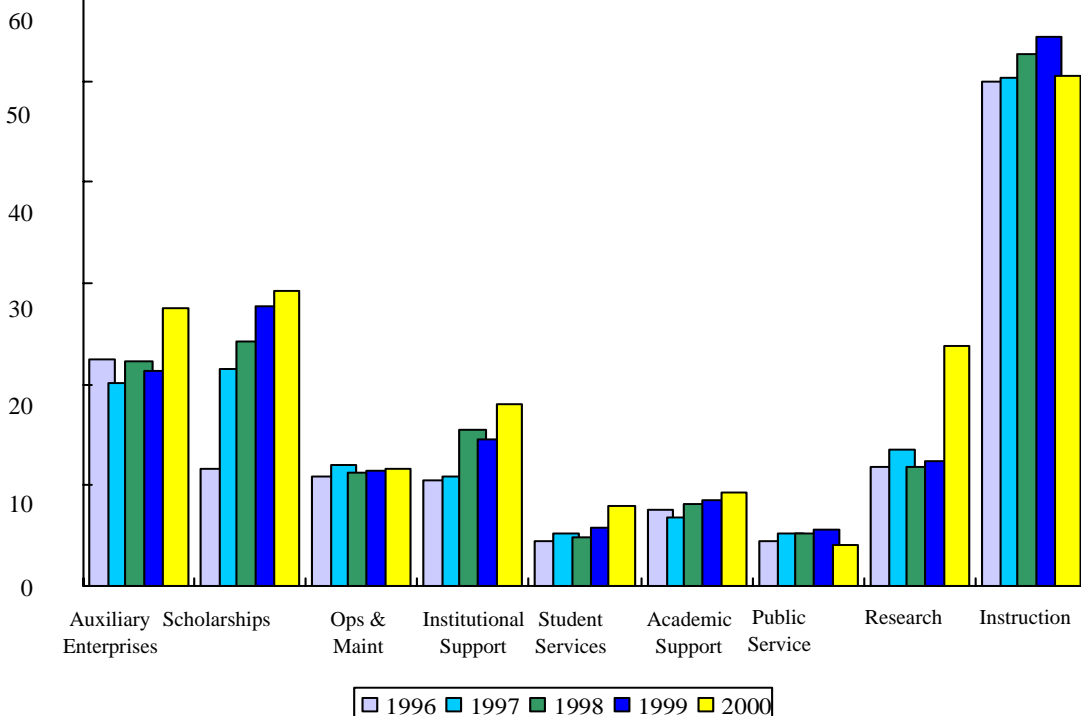

## DEFINITION OF TERMS USED

### Glossary

#### ***SECTION II: NEW STUDENTS***

**Regular Admit** Students who graduate in the top half of their high school class or score a minimum of 920 on the SAT or a 20 composite on the ACT are eligible for regular admission.

**START(Provisional)** Texas residents who do not meet the requirements for regular admission may be admitted provisionally. Provisional students must take prescribed courses, attend new student orientation, be advised by a faculty member in the Academic Ad

**Full/Part Time** Undergraduate students who enroll for at least 12 credit hours and graduate students who enroll for at least nine credit hours are considered full-time students.

**Mexican Students** Students listed as 'Mexican' include only international (non-US citizen) students whose country of origin is Mexico.

**Second degree** Students possessing a baccalaureate degree who are pursuing another undergraduate degree.

**Post-baccalaureate** Students enrolled in masters, doctoral, or certificate/endorsement programs.

#### ***SECTION III: STUDENTS***

**Academic Development Center** Provides precollege English and Math courses, usually noted as 'remedial' or 'developmental' courses, to underprepared students. Although not a College, the Academic Development Center often appears on tables with the indivi

**Individual Instruction** Includes independent study, private lesson, practicum, student teaching, internship and cooperative education courses.

**Undeclared/Unclassified Students** Unless otherwise noted, undeclared students are undergraduates with a major of 'General Studies.' At the graduate level, they include students who are not enrolled in a degree, certificate or endorsement program, and ar

**Full Time Equivalent (FTE)** Numerous methods are available to calculate FTE students, but only two are used here. The 15-12-9 method divides the total of all undergraduate credit hours by 15, all masters' credit hours by 12 and all doctoral credit hour

**Success Rate** The proportion of students from an entering first-time freshman cohort who, at a given point in time, have either graduated or are still enrolled at UTEP.

#### ***SECTION IV: PROGRAMS***

**Organized Classes** Lectures, laboratories, seminars, or any combination of these types of instruction.

**Grades** In addition to the usual A - F: I=incomplete; S=satisfactory in a pass/fail course; U=Unsatisfactory in a pass/fail course; P=in progress, course must be repeated; W=withdrawal; N=temporary administrative notation intended to be replaced with an

**Semester Credit Hour (SCH)** A unit of measurement assigned to a course. Total SCH are computed by multiplying the number of credit hours assigned to a course by the number of students enrolled in the course.

#### ***SECTION V: FACULTY***

**Tenured/Tenure-track faculty** All faculty with one of the following ranks: Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor or Instructor.

**Nontenure-track faculty** All faculty with a rank of lecturer, instructor in clinical nursing, visiting faculty or specialist. Assistant instructors, teaching assistants, or adjunct faculty are included if they are teachers of record.

**Full-time** All faculty with one of the following ranks, regardless of the time actually employed: Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, or Instructor; also, nontenure-track faculty whose percent time is at least 90% in direct instructiona

**Part-time** All nontenure-track faculty whose percent time is less than 90% in direct instructional activity.

**Full Time Equivalent (FTE)** As of Fall 1996, FTE faculty are defined by the percent of their time spent in direct instructional activity. Prior to Fall 1996, FTE faculty were defined by the percent of their time which was paid from faculty salary funds,

**Terminal Degree** Highest degree awarded in a particular field. The Master of Fine Arts (MFA) is considered the terminal degree in Fine Arts, for example.
