## **ARTIST STATEMENT INFORMATION:**

This year students will have the option to submit an artist statement/statement with their work. They can write a different statement for each of the pieces submitted, or create a general statement and provide a copy to be displayed next to each piece submitted. The basic guidelines are as follows:

**The artist statement should be 150-200 words and answer the following:**

- 1) What is the idea(s) behind the piece?
- 2) How did you choose the materials and how do they inform the idea?
- 3) How does this piece fit into the trajectory of your art/your overall oeuvre?

**The Rubin Center will provide the following support to assist students in writing a statement:**

Every Monday we will post a different article or link about writing an artist statement on our **Facebook Page**. Students can also post questions on our page, and we will post an answer visible to everyone.

We will have two artist statement workshops in the **Rubin Gallery** where students can bring a draft statement for commentary and feedback. Workshop dates/times:

**Friday, March 2nd at 3pm**  
**Thursday, March 8th at 5pm**

**Artwork and artists statements will be submitted on Monday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> and Tuesday, April 3 between 10 am and 4pm.
