STEP 1

Apply online to the Educator Preparation Program (EPP) in the College of Education

Requirements are:

- a. Complete 60 semester credit hours, including all Core Curriculum and 15 hours in your teaching area
- b. Have a minimum cumulative UTEP GPA and major GPA or 2.75
- c. Take the 240Tutoring.com Diagnostic Content Exam (no minimum score required)
- d. Attend a College of Education Testing Seminar
- e. Complete the EPP essay and EPP application

Take the FREE 50 question Diagnostic (practice) test for your content area on 240 Tutoring.com.

NOTE: You do NOT have to subscribe and pay to take this free test.

You can access the free test by searching for and selecting your preparation handbook or use these links:

- Mathematics 7-12: <u>Mathematics 7-12 (235) Practice Test</u> (150 minutes)
- Physics/Math 7-12: Both <u>Physical Science 6-12 (243) Practice Test</u> (150 minutes) AND <u>Mathematics 7-12 (235) Practice Test</u> (150 minutes)

Attend the Test Prep Session to learn how to interpret your results and create a study plan.

At the session you will use your Diagnostic exam results to create a study plan. NOTE: You must upload the plan with your online EPP application. Sessions are announced at the beginning of each semester. To register for a Testing Session email Ms. Lluvia Parral at lnparral@utep.edu.

Meet with the College of Science - Director of Secondary Education to discuss your EPP application, certification testing and timeline to graduation, and to receive a signed copy of your degree plan.

• Complete the Educator Preparation Program (EPP) essay. Use the rubric to assess and improve your writing and make sure to include examples.

RECOMMENDED: Submit your essay to the Writing Center for review. Attach the slip or email from the Writing Center to your essay when you apply.

- Submit your EPP Application online
- Once your EPP Application is approved, you will receive an email from the College of Education regarding the EPP Workshop

You MUST attend the EPP Admission Workshop to be admitted to the EPP.

• There are usually NO EPP workshops or admissions in July and August.

Pass the 240Tutoring.com Content Practice Exam (you have three attempts)

CONSIDER THIS: It takes the average student <u>90 hours</u> of preparation to pass one of the teacher certification exams.

- Allow time for retakes of each test, including at least 50 hours of study time.
- LOOK UP and LEARN material you do not know or answer incorrectly.
- Do NOT take an exam without consistently getting 85-90% of practice questions correct.
- When planning, consider your work schedule, family commitments of time, and finances.

This is the first of the four tests you must pass to register for your student teaching course.

Science majors - take the exam after you have taken all freshman & sophomore level science courses in your degree plan

Math majors - take the exam after you have taken STAT 3325 and MATH 3329

PREPARING: If possible, attend the TEXES Boot Camp to prepare for Content exams. The College of Science Secondary Education Program offers this 2-week camp in May.

SCORING: Passing grade is 80% and you have 3 attempts to pass. When you pass, send your score report to lnparral@utep.edu to be approved for your state test.



Pass the TExES Content Exam (you have five attempts)

CONSIDER THIS: It takes the average student <u>90 hours</u> of preparation to pass one of the teacher certification exams.

- Allow time for retakes of each test, including at least 50 hours of study time.
- LOOK UP and LEARN material you do not know or answer incorrectly.
- Do NOT take an exam without consistently getting 85-90% of practice questions correct.
- When planning, consider your work schedule, family commitments of time, and finances.

This is the second of the four tests you must pass to register for your student teaching course.

To register for this exam, you must:

- Attend the EPP admission workshop and be admitted to the EPP
- Receive clearance from UTEP College of Education
- Set up a TEAL profile with TEA https://tea.texas.gov/texas-educators/certification/educator-certification-online-system
- Set up a profile with the Educator Certification Examination program https://www.tx.nesinc.com/
- Register online for the exam https://www.tx.nesinc.com/. The tests are computer administered. Note that reporting of scores occurs within one week of taking the test.

PREPARING: If possible, attend the TEXES Boot Camp to prepare for Content exams. The College of Science Secondary Education Program offers this 2-week camp in May.

SCORING: A passing score is 240 out of 300 (80%) and you have 5 attempts to pass.

If you do not pass, you must create a new study plan to retest. If you score less than 240, email Ms. Lluvia Parral at Inparral@utep.edu to develop a new plan for retesting approval.

NOTE: You must wait 30 days between each exam attempt.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE: If you take <u>and</u> pass your TEXES Content exam at least 6 months prior to the start of your student teaching semester, you will be **REIMBURSED** for the cost of the exam once you begin the student teaching internship.

Pass the 240Tutoring.com PPR Practice Exam (you have three attempts)

- LOOK UP and LEARN material you do not know or answer incorrectly.

- Set up a profile with the Educator Certification Examination program https://www.tx.nesinc.com/
- Register online for the exam https://www.tx.nesinc.com/. The tests are computer administered. Note that reporting of scores occurs within one week of taking the test.

Apply and complete student teaching semester (all other coursework must be complete)

To be registered for this course you must:

- · Be admitted to the EPP.
- Have completed ALL other required courses on your degree plan.
- Passed both the TExES Content and PPR exams.
- Have completed 30 hours of field experience (per the College of Education).
- Submitted an Application for Student Teaching

Visit <u>www.utep.edu/science/teach-math-science</u> for requirement deadlines. Apply on-line at https://coe.utep.edu/epop/apply.

NOTE: The College of Education Office of Student Teaching will register you for the course and arrange for your Student Teaching placement.

Confirm your registration in the student teaching course prior to the start of the semester.

CONSIDER THIS: The student teaching calendar aligns to the school district calendars. You must attend student teacher orientation <u>AND</u> district orientation prior to starting your student teaching semester.

Summer classes may conflict with fall student teaching.

Do <u>NOT</u> plan vacations without knowing those calendars.

Confirmation of graduation and attend graduate information session

To receive your diploma you must:

- Meet with your CORE academic advisor to discuss graduation BEFORE the beginning of the student teaching semester and follow their instructions to get graduation confirmation
- Make sure that you complete student teaching internship requirements and all other courses in your degree plan.
- Run a degree evaluation to make sure that all degree requirements have been completed and are shown on the evaluation.
- An email will be sent from the College of Science CORE to confirm your for graduation
- A second email will be sent with a link for a graduation information session attend this session to understand the next steps.

NOTE: It takes about 1 month after finals week for your transcript to show that your degree was awarded.



Apply for Teacher Certification (must be recommended by College of Education; must be able to pass a background check; social security number required)

While you may apply for certification at the end of student teaching, the College of Education <u>MUST</u> endorse you for certification. Your degree must be awarded for them to do so.

NOTE: It takes about one month after finals for your degree to be posted.

In order for your teaching certification to be endorsed, you must have completed the student teaching internship, required observations, and degree must have been awarded.

TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATION:

- Visit https://tea.texas.gov/
- Click on the TEAL link located at the top of the page.
- Access the system using personal credentials.
- Click on the Educator hyperlink in the middle of the page.
- Select standard certificate from the menu on the left of the page.
- Select The University of Texas at El Paso (University Based) under entity.
- Enter the certification field.
- Pay the required fees (\$78 application fee and \$45 fingerprint fee) and submit the application.
