Notable Locations

Don Haskins Center

The "Don" is home to the UTEP men's and women's basketball teams. It is named after UTEP's Hall of Fame coach Don Haskins. In addition to hosting sporting events, it is used for UTEP commencement and is the city's premier entertainment venue for concerts and events.

Sun Bowl Stadium

For close to 60 years, Sun Bowl Stadium has been the home of the Miners, as well as host of one of the longest-running college football bowl games in the country. Nestled in the Franklin Mountains, the Sun Bowl is one of the most unique college football stadiums in America.

Centennial Plaza

Located in the heart of campus, Centennial Plaza is a large open space that captures the beauty of the Chihuahuan Desert landscape. It serves as the hub for student life and hosts many campus events. The plaza also showcases a beautiful, hand-carved and hand-painted Lhakhang, a gift from the Kingdom of Bhutan.

Mining Minds Pickaxe

The top and bottom of the "Mining Minds" sculpture is perforated. These holes are binary code – a series of ones and zeros – which reads, "Believe in yourself and in your dreams. Believe in UTEP and its aspirations. Share the dream!" The sculpture is illuminated in the evenings, and on special occasions it is lit up in orange and blue.

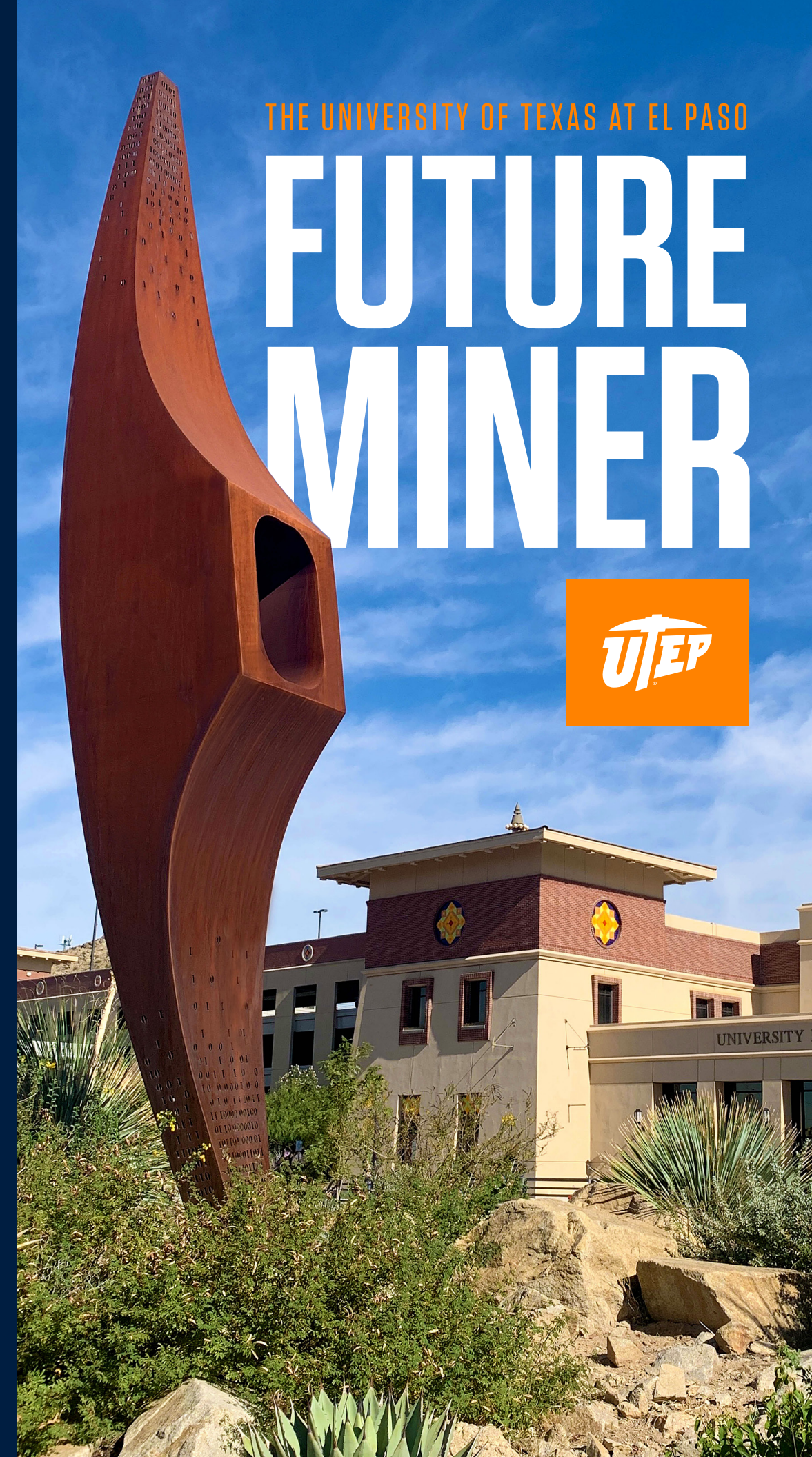

Path 1 - High School Ranking and Test Scores

Path 2 - College Readiness

You are admissible if you meet college readiness benchmarks outlined in Texas Administrative Code §4.54, including sufficient scores on the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Assessment, SAT, ACT, or through successful completion of college-level coursework.

Path 3 - Provisional Freshman Admission

First-time, first year students who do not meet the requirements for admission under criteria listed above and who score below the college readiness benchmark on the Texas Success Initiative Assessment (TSI), as defined in Texas Administrative Code §4.54, are eligible for provisional admission through the University's START Program.

**The START Program offers mathematics and/or English (reading and writing) instruction during the first terms of enrollment to prepare students for successful completion of college-level mathematics and English courses.*

More than 12 college-level credit hours	Cumulative 2.0 GPA with grades of C or better
<i>Students must declare all previously attended institutions on the admissions application.</i>

UTEP Academic Scholars Program

Investing the time to apply for scholarships can really pay off. Each year, UTEP awards more than \$2 million in scholarship funds to high-achieving students, just like you!

Whether you are eligible for a UTEP academic scholarship or one of thousands offered by employers, private companies, and professional and social organizations, UTEP's Office of Scholarships is available to assist you with the scholarship search and the application process.

Terry Foundation Scholarship

Full cost of attendance - Merit based

The Terry Foundation Scholarship funds incoming freshmen who will attend UTEP in the fall semester immediately after graduating from a Texas high school. This full-ride scholarship covers all costs of tuition, fees, books, and housing. It also provides funding for a semester abroad.

UTEP Presidential Scholarship

\$8,000 per year - Merit based
Total award for 4 years: \$32,000

Awarded to the student ranked No.1 in their high school class at a Region 19 school at the end of their junior year. For more information and to view qualifying high schools, visit the UTEP scholarship website.

The cost of tuition and mandatory fees at UTEP is just over \$8,000. The Presidential Scholarship covers a significant percentage of the student's costs to attend UTEP.

UTEP Academic Scholarship

\$1,000 - \$5,000 per year - Merit based
Total award for 4 years: \$4,000 - \$20,000

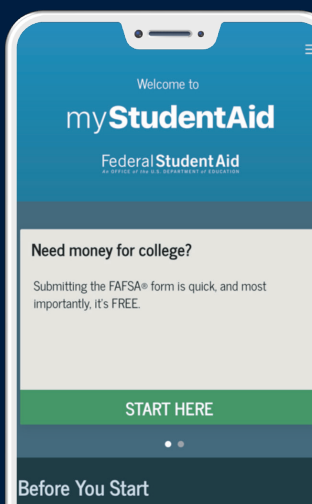
Completing and submitting the FAFSA is free and quick. Students and parents can file online at fafsa.gov or by downloading the "myStudentAid" mobile app.
