- ✓ Apply online by submitting your federal résumé and other required documentation (unofficial transcripts are acceptable)
- ✓ Check application status regularly and Be Patient!

- ✓ Includes ALL required information
- ✓ Has volunteer, military, industry, and/or academic experiences listed
