


Background

Challenges

- State appropriation reductions of \$6.6 million per year; still below 2010-11 funding levels prior to reduction of \$27.2 million
- Escalating healthcare costs
 - Increased by approximately \$1.2 million in last fiscal year
 - Estimated increase of \$1 million current fiscal year
- Basic increases in the cost of goods and services
- \$4.2 million increase in the cost of Hazelwood Exemption since 2011
- Utility costs
 - Estimated \$500,000 increase in current year
 - El Paso Electric pending rate case
- Competitive salaries for faculty and staff




Comparison of State Appropriations to Total UTEP Operating Expenses






UTEP Revenue Comparison FY84 & FY14

Background

Cost Efficiency / Containment Measures

- Extensive review of vacant positions, eliminating "non-mission critical" positions
- Flexible purchasing and travel freeze (Estimated savings of \$2.0 million)
- Aggressive energy management strategies (Estimated savings of \$626,000 in FY 2017)
- Hiring freeze (Estimated savings of \$2.0 million)
- Strategic outsourcing of non-core functions
- Continue to utilize conservative budget management strategies





Financial Aid

- Students on Financial Aid AY 16-17: 20,404 (3% change from AY 15-16)
 - The number of students benefitting from financial aid averages between 72-74% of the total number of students each year.
- Pell funding currently scheduled to be available summer of 2018
- UTEP Promise
 - Available to undergraduate students whose yearly family income is less than \$30,000
- UTEP Scholarships Academic
 - Always increasing in both numbers of students and dollars expended
 - Total: 1,357 students / \$1,575,524
- Outside scholarships \$2.1 million
